Commissioner Stine:

Recent reports disclosing the discovery of pejorative emails by an MPCA regulator pertaining to the Sandpiper oil pipeline are deeply concerning and raise serious questions about the fairness, objectivity, and ultimate credibility of state agencies on regulatory matters.

The Sandpiper project is a key component to the economies of numerous counties, cities, townships, and school districts along its route. It has strong support in Greater Minnesota not only because of the jobs, sturdy tax base, and other economic benefits it delivers, but for the ecological benefits it provides as a safe, environmentally sound alternative to hauling Bakken light crude by rail through our towns, or over our already congested and aging highway system.

We have wondered with frustration at the delays in approving this project and the benefits it would provide to local communities across the state. If these delays are in any way attributable to the personal beliefs of staff within the department who are actively working in opposition rather than in strict adherence to applicable rule and law, those individuals need to be identified and weeded out of the process.

Our regulatory process relies on the confidence that it is administered by state agency staff who are impartial and not motivated to put personal political philosophies ahead of a strict adherence to the laws of the state.

The revelation that a state regulator would be working in active opposition to a permit application is a startling development that raises a disconcerting but critical question about how deep this problem runs within the agencies of the state.

I hope you can appreciate the gravity of the concern that exists over this discovery. It tempers a notion that is widely held among public and privately held organizations alike, who understand - *but are afraid to say* - a silent wall of disdain exists deep within the regulatory agencies for projects that would deliver positive economic benefits to Greater Minnesota.

There is a clear and growing perception that you cannot build in this state anymore, because it is becoming exhaustive and far too costly - compared to the ultimate benefit - to run the precarious obstacles of the bureaucratic minefield. This is a circumstance that did not always exist and raises real questions about the type of employee the agencies have been hiring over the last 10 to 15 years. Any investigation should take a long look at correcting an imbalance in hiring practices that do not recognize the value of a candidate who understands economic development and environmental protection are not mutually exclusive.

We support the request for a full and independent investigation into this incident by the Legislative Auditor, and into whether other employees are working in advocacy rolls against good projects, rather than abiding by standards established under the law.

I'm sure you agree there can be few issues more important than restoring credibility to the regulatory process. We hope you take these concerns seriously and dedicate your best effort to alleviate them.

# AITKIN COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY DEPOT HIGHLIGHTS NEWSLETTER WINTER 2016 – Volume 21, Issue 1



The year 2015 flew by and before we know it summer 2016 will be here. With it will come the unveiling of our new book "Schools of Aitkin County". The past two years has been spent researching, and collecting photos and information to be included in the book. Many hours were spent interviewing Aitkin County residents about the early country schools. County and Historical Society records were pored over to determine the number and location of all the schools in the county. Sometimes information from two sources did not agree so a third source needed to be found to determine what was correct. Photos for some schools never materialized. The records for some schools had been destroyed by fires and others thrown away. Information about many schools is gone forever and we will never know. We are busy getting permission to use some articles in our book and a UPC code has been purchased. Information and photographs are being assembled to form our new book.

After seven and a half years I will be retiring as your administrator this spring. I have enjoyed working for you and the Volunteers have been beyond great. They followed my lead, no matter how crazy they thought the idea was, and accomplished many projects to make the museum more fun and interesting to visit. This past year many visitors from around the country expressed their surprise and joy at the number of displays and the quality of them. They felt that our museum was better than most of the other museums they had visited. This can be attributed to our volunteers. Their enthusiasm and dedication for the museum shows through in everything that they do. To our volunteers I say: **Thank You! Thank You!** It is my hope that the new administrator will be embraced by the volunteers and that the society will continue to grow.

Last year 12,700 people visited our museum, web site or one of our events. They came from 37 US States, 10 Foreign Countries and 180 Minnesota Communities. Our museum has a big impact on the local economy. First of all we try to buy everything we need at the museum from local businesses starting with our member businesses. There is a constant stream of visitors who leave our museum and head to local restaurants, gas stations and Jaques Art Center. Another thing that we have been able to do is connect people living in Europe requesting information about their ancestors who traveled to America with relatives living here in Aitkin County. That is always fun when we can do that. It will not be very long before our visitor ship will be more than the population of Aitkin County.

Our Annual Garage Sale has been very successful over the past three years because of all of the generous donations received. This past year we broke the 11,000 dollar mark. When you are cleaning out your basement, garage, closets, drawers, or downsizing don't forget about the museum to receive those unwanted items. **All donations are tax deductible.** You have already cleaned everything out, How about donating some time working the sale. Hundreds of hours are spent setting up and marking everything for the sale. It takes many volunteer hours working the actual sale. Come and join the craziness. I will be gone, but plan on coming up from the cities and working the sale. If this event is going to continue to grow we need everyone's help with collecting, setting up, sorting, marking and working this event. As we grow older (I like to call it maturing) it seems that it takes longer to accomplish tasks and not able to do others. At least in my case, I am not as strong as I used to be.



### **ARTICLE 8: ASSOCIATION DELEGATES & DISTRICTS**

Section 1. Association Delegates Each member county shall be entitled to a number of delegates equal to three more than the number of persons on the board of county commissioners of the member county. Delegates shall be appointed annually by the county board from among the officials and employees of the county. Each delegate so appointed shall be eligible to vote at any meeting of the Association or to be elected an officer or director of the Association. The right to vote at any meeting of the Association or to hold an office or directorship in the Association shall terminate when such person ceases to be a delegate from a member county or the county that delegate represents ceases to be a member of the Association. A vacancy in the office of delegate shall be filled by the county board for the unexpired term.
