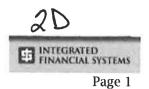

The Ordinance Review committee consisting of: Brian Napstad - Commissioner, Anne Marcotte - Commissioner, Pete Gansen - P&Z, Steve Hughes - SWCD, Nathan Burkett – Former County Administrator and myself, have met several times over the past few months to review proposed changes to the General Zoning and Shoreland Management Ordinances.

The proposed changes are: General Zoning Ordinance to update Sections 3, 5, 8, 16, 17, Classification List, and Appendix B; Shoreland Management Ordinance to update 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. Enclosed is a copy of the proposed amendments to each of the ordinances. Strikethrough is language that is proposed for deletion and red is proposed new language. You will note most of the changes are reference corrections or minor language changes.

At the November 22, 2016 Aitkin County Board of Commissioners meeting I will be requesting approval to hold the public hearing on the proposed amendments before the Aitkin County Planning Commission on December 19, 2016.

General Ordinance Proposed Amendments 2016

3.26A <u>Group Home</u>: Group homes means a living situation that provides at a minimum, room and/or board to unrelated people who live in certain licensed or registered group living arrangements.

- 3.57 Sign: "Sign" means any display or device designed to inform
- 3.05 <u>Bluff:</u> "Bluff" means a topographic feature such as a hill, cliff, or embankment having the following characteristics (an area with an average slope of less than 18 percent over a distance of 50 feet or more shall not be considered a part of the bluff):
 - A. The slope rises at least 25 feet above the toe of the bluff;
 - B. The grade of the slope from the toe of the bluff to a point 25 feet or more above the toe of the bluff averages 30 percent or greater.

A variance from a setback shall not be required provided the Aitkin County Soil and Water Conservation District has reviewed an evaluation of development procedure, prepared by a registered engineer, to ensure proper erosion and sedimentation techniques are employed and slope stability is maintained.

[SECTION 5]

SIGNS (DISPLAYS)

- 5.0 <u>Purpose:</u> It is the intent of this ordinance to permit business signs wherever they are moderate in size and design and consistent with the public safety and the welfare and aesthetics of surrounding areas.
- 5.01 <u>Permit Required:</u> Except as otherwise specifically authorized, no sign shall be located, erected, moved, reconstructed, extended, or structurally altered within the County until a permit has been issued by the Zoning Administrator. No permit shall be issued for a sign not in conformity with the size, type, number, location, and use regulations affecting each zoning district.
 - a. The change in advertising message, maintenance, and repair or the use of extensions, cut-outs, or embellishments upon an existing structure shall not be considered an enlargement, extension structure, or structural alteration

provided that thereby the advertising structure is not caused to exceed any size limitation imposed by this ordinance.

- b. Lighted advertising signs shall be shielded so as to prevent beams or rays of light from being directed at any habitable building or dwelling or at any portion of the traveled way of such roadway and shall not be of such intensity or brilliance as to cause glare or impair the vision of any motor vehicle operator or obscure any official traffic sign, device, or signal.
- 5.02 Exceptions: A permit shall not be required for the following classes of signs:

5.04 Signs – No Permit Required:

a. <u>Class A Signs:</u> A. Official traffic control signs, and informational notice erected by federal, state, or local units of government. Only official identification, directional, or traffic control signs shall be allowed within the public right-of-way.

b. <u>Class B Signs:</u> B. On-premises real estate signs, residential identification, government issued warning and similar signs not greater than nine (9) square feet in area. In residential zoning districts no more than two (2) such signs may be located on the premises. Signs shall not be spaced closer than every 50 feet.

- Flags and insignias of any government except when displayed in connection with commercial promotion.
- 2. Logal notices, identification, information, or directional signs erected by governmental bodies.
- Integral decorative or architectural features of buildings, except letters, trademarks, moving parts, or moving lights.
- 4. Signs directing and guiding traffic and parking on private property, but bearing no advertising matter.
- 5. A temporary sign indicating real estate for rent or for sale related to the premises only on which it is located.
- Political poster in accordance with applicable state laws provided that they are removed within ten (10) days following the election for which they were intended.

C. Off-premises directory signs in the specific interest of the traveling public which advertise a business activity, an area of interest, or a service available at the specific location within twelve (12) air miles of the premises on which it is located.

a. <u>Type 1:</u> Recreational directory signs indicating the direction to a cottage, resort, residence, or similar use. Such signs that identify the dwelling owners. Such signs shall not exceed four (4) square feet in area. When a common posting is provided all such signs shall be attached thereto. Recreational directory signs may be placed at the right-of-way line of the roadway provided they are not within three hundred (300) feet of an existing residence. Information on such signs may be of reflective materials.

5.03 2 Prohibited Characteristics of Signs:

- a. No sign shall resemble, imitate, or approximate the shape, size, form, or color of railroad or traffic signs, signals, or devices.
- b. No sign shall be so located as to interfere with the visibility or effectiveness of any official traffic sign or signal, or with driver vision at any access point or intersection.
- c. No sign shall be erected, relocated, or maintained so as to prevent free ingress or egress from any door, window, or fire escape, and no sign shall be attached to a standpipe or fire escape.
- d. No sign shall exceed the maximum height limitations of the district in which it is located.
- e. No sign shall have an electronic or mechanical changeable message at intervals of less than five (5) minutes, except for that portion of a sign that displays time and temperature.
- fe. No sign structure shall be so designed that both sides of the structure can be viewed from any one traffic lane.

5.034 General Design of Signs:

- a. Back to Back Signs there shall not be more than a four (4) foot distance between sign faces. Signs shall face in opposite directions.
- b. End to End Signs there shall be no more than two (2) feet between signs and the signs shall be in a straight line. No more than two signs are allowed to be constructed end to end.
- c. V-Shaped Signs no interior angle of a sign shall exceed more than a thirty (30) degree angle from perpendicular to the center line of the road (see illustration and chart).

For illustration purposes V-shaped signs only:

Length of sign	Maximum distance between sign faces
8 feet and less	8.0 feet
12 feet	12.0 feet

20 feet	20.0 feet

d. Signs erected back to back, end to end or in a V-type construction shall be deemed to be one sign structure. The largest advertising area on either side of the sign structure shall not exceed the allowable square footage measurements applicable to the sign class and the sign type.

5.045 Classification of Signs Requiring Permit:

A. <u>On-Premise Signs: On-premise signs, which advertise business activity or service performed on the property</u>. On-premise signs may be placed at the right-of-way line of the roadway, unless otherwise specified. All other setback distance requirements of the underlying zoning district must be met. On-premises signs shall not be spaced closer than three hundred (300) feet to other advertising signs on the same side of the road except back to back, v-shaped or end to end.

1. Class C Signs: Type 1:

- a. <u>Type 1:</u> Signs advertising a permitted home occupation or professional office in residential area. Such signs shall not exceed nine (9) square feet in area, and if illuminated shall be indirectly lighted. No more than one (1) such sign for each use located on the premises shall be permitted. No permit necessary.
- b. <u>Type 2:</u> Signs or bulletin boards for public, charitable, or religious institutions. Such signs in the farm/residential, open and public zoning districts shall not exceed sixteen twenty-four (24) square feet in area, and no more than one (1) sign for each roadway upon which the property faces shall be permitted. Such signs may be placed at the right of way line of the roadway. Permit required, however, no fee for permit.

<u>Type 2:</u>

c. <u>Type 3:</u> Signs advertising a business activity or service available in a commercial or manufacturing zoning district industrial area, or a business that is permitted in the zoning district or a business on commercially assessed property that is allowed with a conditional use permit, shall have no No more than two such signs for each roadway upon which the property faces shall be permitted. Such signs shall not exceed eighty (80) square feet in combined area. No more than one (1) such sign for each story may be attached to a building facade, and no sign may project more than four (4) feet beyond a building when attached thereto, or be higher than four (4) feet above the top roof line. Free standing signs shall not exceed twenty-two (22) feet in height from above the ground.

- d. <u>Type 4:</u> Signs advertising the sale of farm products on the premises. Such signs shall not exceed twenty four (24) square feet in area, and no more than three (3) non-lighted signs advertising produce may be erected within one hundred (100) feet of the stand.
- e <u>Type 5</u>: Signs advertising a resort or recreational business activity or products available. Such signs shall not exceed twenty four (24) square feet in area, and no more than one (1) such sign for each roadway upon which the property faces shall be permitted.
- B. <u>Off-Premises Signs:</u> Off-premises signs may only be placed in a commercial or manufacturing zone outside the shoreland zone. Refer to the Aitkin County Shoreland Management Ordinance Section 4.23 for guidance on whether an off-premise sign may be authorized within the shoreland zone through the conditional use permit process. Off-premise signs must be placed ten (10) feet off the right-of-way line of the roadway outside the road right-of-way, unless otherwise specified. All other setback distance requirements of the underlying zoning district must be met.
 - 1. <u>Class D Signs:</u> Signs or billboards which advertise general brand of product, an area of interest, a business activity or service available which is not in direct relation to the use of the premises on which it is located. Such signs shall not exceed two hundred (200) square feet in area. Free standing signs shall be erected outside a line parallel with and ten (10) feet from the roadway right of way, shall not exceed twenty-two (22) feet in height above the ground or be located within three hundred (300) feet of an existing residence. Off-premises signs shall not be spaced closer than three hundred (300) feet to other advertising signs on the same side of the road except back to back , v-shaped or end to end. Off premises signs must be placed one hundred (100) feet from property lines.
 - <u>Class E Signs:</u> Off-premises directory signs in the specific interest of the traveling public which advertise a business activity, an area of interest, or a service available at the specific location within twelve (12) air miles of the premises on which it is located.

- a. <u>Type 1:</u> Recreational directory signs indicating the direction to a cottage, resort, residence, or similar use. Such signs shall not exceed four (4) square feet in area. When a common posting is provided all such signs shall be attached thereto. Recreational directory signs may be placed at the right of way line of the roadway provided they are not within three hundred (300) feet of an existing residence. Information on such signs may be of reflective materials.
- b. <u>Type 2:</u> Signs advertising a business or service available. Such signs shall not exceed twenty four (24) square feet in area, and no more than two (2) such signs relating to any one use shall be permitted in the approaching direction along any one roadway.

5.056 Nonconforming Signs:

Nonconforming signs shall be subject to the provisions of SECTION 12:

5.07 Substitution

Commercial speech is not favored over non-commercial speech. A non-commercial message may be displayed upon any sign.

- 8.21 A permit is required for the construction or placement of buildings or building additions (and including such related activities as construction of decks and signs), and the installation and/or alteration of sewage treatment systems and those grading and filling activities not exempted by Section 3.70 of this ordinance. Application for a permit shall be made to the Zoning Administrator on the forms provided. The application shall include the necessary information so that the Zoning Administrator or his authorized Representative can determine the site's suitability for the intended use and that a compliant sewage treatment system will be provided.
- 8.22 A permit authorizing an addition to an existing structure shall stipulate that an identified nonconforming sewage treatment system, as defined by Section 18 17.01, shall be reconstructed or replaced in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.
- 8.3 <u>Certificate of Zoning Compliance</u>: The Zoning Administrator or his authorized Representative shall issue a certificate of zoning compliance for each permitted activity requiring certification. All permitted activities as specified in Section 3.70 3.74 of the ordinance shall be inspected to ensure the use of land conforms to the requirements of this ordinance. Any use, arrangement, or construction at variance with the authorized by permit shall be deemed a violation of this ordinance.

16.0 Travel Trailer Park Campground:

F. The setback from any adjacent public road, street, or highway shall be fifty (50) feet. and any The setback distance from an adjacent property line would shall be (50) thirty (30) feet.

- 17.0 (2) The application for an Interim Use Permit shall include:
 - a. All information required for a conditional use permit,
 - b. Floor plan of the structure, including the number of bedrooms with dimensions and all other sleeping accommodations,
 - c. A to-scale site plan which shows locations and dimensions of property lines, the structure intended for licensing, accessory structures, parking areas, shore recreational facilities (docking plan, fire pit area, swim beach, etc.) and sewage treatment systems.

 - f. Current water test from an accredited laboratory with test results for nitrate-nitrogen and coliform bacteria.
 - g. Plan for garbage disposal.
 - h. Applicant must submit a pet policy.
 - i. In each bedroom and any room used for sleeping, show the dimensions of egress windows on the drawing and the style (double hung, sliding or casement).

17.01, B – All private sewage treatment systems must meet or exceed the Aitkin County Individual Subsurface Sewage Treatment System and Wastewater-Ordinance No. 1 and

Classification List - "Group Home" - change to "Group Home - 7 or more residents".

 "Dwelling – Secondary Unit" – allow as permitted in Farm Residential, Public and Open and as a CUP/IUP in Residential, Commercial and Manufacturing.

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Shoreland Ordinance Proposed Amendments 2016

- **2.6** at the end of the paragraph add "Mississippi Headwaters Board Comprehensive Management Plan".
- 2.711 Accessory structure or facility. "Accessory structure" or "facility" means any building or improvement subordinate to a principal structure which, because of the nature of its use, can reasonably be located at or greater than normal structure setbacks. An accessory structure shall not be used for human habitation. Examples of accessory structures are garages, pole buildings, sheds, gazebos, decks, platforms, storage containers, fish houses, and similar structures.
- 2.719a Building Coverage. "Building Coverage" means the ground surface covered by any building or appurtenance, including, but not limited to, decks, platforms, overhangs and projections therefrom, outdoor furnaces, fishhouses, sheds, carports, lean-to's, or any similar building. Building coverage does not include eaves of 24 inches or less.
- **2.740 Guest cottage.** "Guest cottage" means a structure used as a dwelling unit that may contains sleeping spaces and/or kitchen and/or bathroom facilities or any other feature that would make the structure more oriented towards a sleeping unit in addition to those provided in the primary dwelling unit on a lot.
- 2.740A Habitable Structure. "Habitable Structure" means a structure which contains one or more of the following one or more sleeping areas, bath tub, or shower, toilet facilities, or any other feature that would make the structure more oriented towards a dwelling unit than an accessory structure.
- 2.744 Impervious surface coverage. "Impervious surface coverage" means any structure, facility or surface that sheds water including structures and facilities, sewage treatment system absorption areas (equal to 190 sq.ft./bedroom), retaining walls, and roadway surfaces and parking areas. Impervious surface does not include eaves of two feet 24 inches and less.
- **2.759 Patio.** "Patio" means any surface other than a deck or platform that is used in a similar manner as a deck or platform but does not exceed 6 inches above grade, excluding accessories. Sidewalks less than five (5) feet in width are not considered patios.
- 2.776 Setback. "Setback" means the minimum horizontal distance between a structure, including overhangs, eaves or projections (of greater than twenty four (24) inches) therefrom, sewage treatment system, or other facility and an ordinary high water level, sewage treatment system, top of a bluff, road right-of-way, property lines, or other facility.
- **2.786 Structure.** "Structure" means any building or appurtenance, including decks, platforms, patios within the building setback from the OHW, overhangs and ...
- **3.11** A permit is required for the construction of buildings or building additions (and including such related activities as construction of decks, platforms, patios within the building setback from the OHW, and signs), the ...

- **4.14, A**. Mississippi River Shoreland that falls within the corridor shall be excluded from this Ordinance and be governed by the Mississippi Headwaters Board Management Plan Ordinance except where this ordinance is more restrictive.
- **5.14**, **D** Lots intended as controlled accesses to public waters or as recreation areas for use by owners of nonriparian lots within subdivisions ...

After Subitem (4). Access for nonriparian lots can only be through a controlled access lot. Easements or other instruments drafted for nonriparian lot owners to allow access to public waters shall be prohibited.

- **5.14, I** Patio's shall be allowed without a variance and not meeting the required setback distance from the ordinary high water level if all of the following criteria and standards are met:
 - (1) The principle structure, excluding decks and platforms, must meet all setback distance requirements in 5.21, A and B.
 - (2) The patio encroachment from the principle structure toward the ordinary high water level does not exceed 20 percent of the existing setback distance of the structure from the ordinary high water level,
 - (3) The patio is not roofed or screened,
 - (4) Impervious surface requirements must be met.
 - (5) The patio must be located within 2 feet of the principle structure.
 - (6) No patio is allowed within the bluff impact zone.
- **5.22, A** (1) for lakes, by placing the lowest floor at a level at least three feet above the highest known water level, or three feet above the ordinary high water level, whichever is higher.
- **5.22, G** In addition to the water oriented accessory structure (WOAS) allowed in 5.22, B, a patio will be allowed that meets the following:
 - 1) Shall be no larger than 2 square foot per lineal foot of lot width, and
 - 2) The patio must be setback from the ordinary high water (OHW) level of at least 10 feet, and
 - 3) The area between the patio and the OHW level must be in native vegetation or grass cover or natural state or not mowed, and
 - 4) The patio runoff must not drain towards the water body.

For all patios within the building setback distance from the OHW that exceed 240 sq.ft in area, a stormwater management plan must be developed (by a licensed engineer in the State of Minnesota, or a soil and water conservation district trained staff or a licensed landscape architect) and constructed to treat the runoff from the patio.

5.31 Vegetation Alterations.

- B. Removal or alteration of vegetation, except for agricultural and forest management uses as regulated in Sections 5.62 and 5.63, respectively, is allowed subject to the following standards:
 - (1) Cutting of trees and shrubs within the shore and bluff impact zones and on steep slopes is not allowed, except as provided for in subparagraph (2) below. Intensive vegetation clearing for forest land conversion to another use outside of

these areas is allowable as a conditional use if an erosion control and sedimentation plan is approved by the soil and water conservation district in which the property is located.

- (2) A vegetation alteration permit is required prior to vegetative clearing in the shore impact zone and bluff impact zone and on steep slopes. In shore impact zones and bluff impact zones and on steep slopes, no clearing or cutting of trees and shrubs will be allowed until a plan is submitted to and reviewed by Aitkin County Soil and Water Conservation District and approved by the Aitkin County Planning and Zoning Office. The approved plan shall be submitted with the application for the vegetation alteration permit. The approval of the plan may require revegetation to meet the intent of this section. Limited pruning and trimming of trees is allowed to provide a view to the water from the principal dwelling site and picnic areas, access paths, beach and watercraft access areas, and permitted water-oriented accessory structures or facilities, provided that:
- (a) the screening of structures, vehicles, or other facilities as viewed from the water, assuming summer, leaf-on conditions, shall not be substantially reduced;
- (b) along rivers and lakes, existing shading of water surfaces shall be preserved;
- (c) If the shore impact zone has had no past vegetation removal, as a general rule, the plan would allow removal of up to 1/3 of the trees greater than 5" in diameter 4.5 feet above ground level (DBH), diameter at breast height, and 1/3 of the trees/shrubs less than 5" (DBH) in a non-contiguous pattern as long as screening is maintained and shading of the shoreline is still provided. To allow access to water bodies for individual lot owners, an open area of 40 feet or 33% of the lot width, whichever is less, may be allowed to be cleared of trees and shrubs, as long as the above 1/3 tree/shrub removal is still in compliance. The clearing shall not extend more than 25 feet landward from the ordinary high water level. A grass cover shall remain to prevent erosion to the water body.

As an incentive to move the above described open areas off the shoreline, if the open area begins at least 25 feet back from the ordinary highwater (OHW) level an open area of 60 feet or 50% of the lot width, whichever is less and 30 feet in depth, may be allowed to be cleared of trees and shrubs, as long as the above 1/3 tree/shrub removal is still in compliance. The area between the OHW level and open area must be left in its natural condition excluding a 10 foot wide access path from the open area to the waterbody.

- (d) Burning of yard waste (including leaves, twigs, stumps, and grass) is not permitted within the shore and bluff impact zones or on steep slopes. A fire ring or pit is allowed as long as it does not exceed 4 3 feet in diameter.
- (e) Exception- Limited pruning is allowed as long as adequate screening and shading as viewed from the water is maintained and preserved, during leaf on periods of the year. Dead, diseased or hazardous trees may be removed with the landowners being encouraged to replace them by planting a species suitable for the site.

5.32 Grading and Filling/Land Alteration Permits

- A. Grading and filling and excavations necessary for the construction of structures, sewage treatment systems, and driveways under validly issued construction permits for these facilities do not require the issuance of a separate land alteration permit. However, the grading and filling standards in this Section E must be incorporated into the issuance of permits for construction of structures, sewage treatment systems, and driveways.
- D. Except for the activities described in Items A and C above, a plan must be submitted to the Aitkin County Soil and Water Conservation District for review and to the Aitkin County Planning and Zoning Office for approval prior to issuance of a land alteration permit. A land alteration permit may require the revegetation of the shore impact zone to meet the intent of Section 5.31.

Activities requiring a land alteration permit:

(1) On steep slopes of 18 percent slope or greater and shore and bluff impact zones - activities that involve the excavation and/or placement of earthen material of more than 240 sq.ft. of area ten (10) cubic yards of material.

With a permit, a minimum amount of excavation and/or placement of material to achieve the goal of the project may be permitted but shall not exceed 30 cubic yards of material. The 30 cubic yards is the maximum amount of excavation or placement of material allowed on an existing parcel of land. The excavation or placement of material shall be done within any existing or proposed recreational use area or access path and not in a separate area; and

(2) Outside of steep slopes of 18 percent slope or greater and shore and bluff impact zones - activities that involve the excavation or placement of more than fifty (50) cubic yards of material.

However, when at any one time, more than 200 cubic yards of excavation or fill is proposed outside the permitted excavation of the structure, an erosion or sedimentation plan must be submitted to the Aitkin County Zoning Office for referral to the Aitkin County Water and Soil Conservation District for technical review and approval.

- (3) Excavation or placement of fill, as described in D (1) and D (2) above, is allowed no more than twice, unless the excavation or placement of fill is to regrade an annual ice ridge.
- (4) Access to water bodies for purposes of launching trailered watercraft require a land alteration permit. A plan must be submitted to the Aitkin County Soil and Water Conservation District for review and to the Aitkin County Planning and Zoning for approval. The plan must show how surface water run-off will be managed to prevent erosion and sedimentation into the water body. The intent is to prevent exposed soil and/or concrete/asphalt driveways to the lake and to use vegetated areas for filtration. In certain cases, if needed to accomplish the purpose of the access, vegetation intermixed with soil/concrete/asphalt may be permitted.

5.52 Specific Standards

- A. As of June 1, 2005, building coverage of lots must not exceed 15 percent of the lot area, and total impervious surface coverage of lots must not exceed 25 percent of the lot area. Lot area must not include wetland areas, bluff areas or land below the ordinary high water ...
- 6.3 Additions/expansions to non-conforming principal structures built prior to January 21, 1992 without a variance. If a variance has been granted for an addition/expansion to a principal structure since January 21, 1992, then Sections 6.3, A, B and C do not apply and a variance is required for any future additions and/or expansions.
 - A. All additions or any enlargement of an existing sub-standard principal structure shall be allowed providing all of the following criteria will be met: (If all of the following criteria are met, a one-time expansion since January 21, 1992 will be allowed without a variance).
 - (1) The addition/expansion will not decrease the setback of the existing structure from the ordinary high water level,
 - (2) The addition/expansion will not exceed 50 percent of the total volume of the existing structure, or exceed 50 percent of the assessed market value as indicated in the records of the County Assessor,
 - (3) The existing structure is setback to a minimum of a line parallel with the Shore Impact Zone,
 - (4) Impervious surface coverage of the parcel or lot shall not exceed 25 percent.
 - (5) The existing structure and proposed addition/expansion must meet all other setback distance requirements of this Ordinance.
 - B. Deck additions shall be allowed without a variance to a structure not meeting the required setback from the ordinary high water level if all of the following criteria and standards are met:
 - (1) a thorough evaluation of the property and structure reveals no reasonable location for a deck meeting or exceeding the existing ordinary high water level setback of the structure;
 - (2) the deck encroachment toward the ordinary high water level (OHWL) does not exceed 15 percent of the existing setback of the structure from the ordinary high water level or does not encroach closer than 30 feet to the OHWL, whichever is more restrictive;
 - (3) The deck is not roofed or screened; and
 - (4) All other setback distance requirements of this Ordinance must be met.
 - C. Platform additions shall be allowed without a variance to a structure not meeting the required setback from the ordinary high water level if all of the following criteria and standards are met:
 - (1) The platform encroachment toward the ordinary high water level does not exceed 20 percent of the existing setback distance of the structure from the ordinary high water level or does not encroach closer than 29 30 feet to the OHWL, whichever is more restrictive.
 - (2) The platform is not roofed or screened, and
 - (3) All other setback distance requirements of this Ordinance must be met.

- D. Patio's shall be allowed without a variance and not meeting the required setback distance from the ordinary high water level if all of the following criteria and standards are met:
 - (1) The patio encroachment from the principle structure toward the ordinary high water level does not exceed 20 percent of the existing setback distance of the structure from the ordinary high water level or does not encroach closer than 30 feet to the OHWL, whichever is more restrictive.
 - (2) The patio is not roofed or screened,
 - (3) Impervious surface requirements must be met,
 - (4) All other setback distance requirements of this Ordinance must be met, and

2016 STATE OF MINNESOTA FEDERAL BOATING SAFETY SUPPLEMENTAL EQUIPMENT GRANT AGREEMENT

This grant agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Natural Resources, Enforcement Division ("State") and Aitkin Co. Sheriff, 217 - 2nd St. NW, Rm. 185, Aitkin, MN 56431 ("Grantee"). The payment address for this grant agreement is Aitkin Co. Treasurer, 209 - 2nd St. NW, Rm. 202, Aitkin, MN 56431.

Recitals

- 1. Under Minnesota Statute §84.026 the State is empowered to enter into this grant.
- 2. The State will make available supplementary funding in the amount noted in this agreement to cover the cost of the specific items for recreational boating safety.
- 3. The Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all services described in this grant agreement to the satisfaction of the State.

Grant Agreement

1 Term of Grant Agreement

11.1

- 1.1 *Effective date*: October 1, 2016 or the date the State obtains all required signatures under Minnesota Statutes § 16B.98, Subdivision 5, whichever is later. Reimbursements will only be made for those expenditures made according to the terms of this grant.
- 1.2 Expiration date: January 31, 2017 or until all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled, whichever occurs first. Reimbursement invoice requests must also be received by the State no later than January 31, 2017. An extension beyond that date may be granted, if requested by the Grantee, and approved in writing by the State's representative. Requests submitted after January 31, 2017 that have not been granted a purchase or reimbursement extension from the State, are not eligible for reimbursement and will become the Grantee's sole responsibility.
- 1.3 Survival of Terms. The following clauses survive the expiration or cancellation of this grant agreement: 8. Liability, 9. State Audits, 10. Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property, 12. Publicity and Endorsement, 13. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue, 15. Data Disclosure and those items in Exhibit A.

2 Grantee's Duties

The Grantee, who is not a state employee, will be reimbursed, as specified in Exhibit A, for the purchase of the items noted there. The Grantee will submit to the State the required documents noted in Exhibit A. The State will make available supplementary funding in the amount noted in this agreement to cover the cost of the specific items for recreational boating safety noted in Exhibit "A." See Exhibit "A" of this agreement for the allowable expenditures specific to this grant. See Exhibit "B" for specific federal requirements that affect this grant.

Reporting Requirements: The Grantee must satisfactorily submit all activity and financial reports by the date(s) requested by the State, unless the State grants an extension in writing.

3 Time

The Grantee must comply with all the time requirements described in this grant agreement. In the performance of this grant agreement, time is of the essence.

4 Consideration and Payment

- 4.1 Consideration. The State will pay for all services performed by the Grantee under this grant agreement as follows:
 - (a) Compensation. The Grantee will be reimbursed only for the specific items listed in Exhibit A up to <u>Twenty thousand seventy-seven</u> dollars (\$20,077.00).
 - (b) Total Obligation. The total obligation of the State to the Grantee under this grant agreement will not exceed <u>Twenty thousand</u> seventy-seven dollars (\$20,077.00)

4.2. Payment

- (a) Invoices. The State will promptly pay the Grantee after the Grantee presents an itemized invoice for the services actually performed and the State's Authorized Representative accepts the invoiced services. Invoices shall be submitted in a form prescribed by the State within the dates previously noted in "Term of Grant Agreement" in this contract. Invoice procedures are specified in Exhibit "A".
- (b) Federal funds. Payments under this grant agreement will be made from federal funds obtained by the State through the U.S. Coast Guard, Department of Homeland Security through the Recreational Boating Safety Financial Assistance program to states, commonwealth and territories (CFDA number 97.012) in 46 U.S.C. 13101-13110. The Grantee is responsible for compliance with all federal requirements imposed on these funds and accepts full financial responsibility for any requirements imposed by the Grantee's failure to comply with federal requirements.

- 4.3 Contracting and Bidding Requirements per Minn. Stat. §471.345; grantees that are municipalities as defined in Subd. 1 must do the following if contracting funds from this grant contract agreement for any supplies, materials, equipment or the rental thereof, or the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of real or personal property:
 - (a) If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$100,000, a formal notice and bidding process must be conducted in which sealed bids shall be solicited by public notice. Municipalities may, as a best value alternative, award a contract for construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance work to the vendor or contractor offering the best value under a request for proposals as described in Minn. Stat. \$16C.28, Subd. 1, paragraph (a), clause (2).
 - (b) If the amount of the contract is estimated to exceed \$25,000 but not \$100,000, the contract may be made either upon sealed bids or by direct negotiation, by obtaining two or more quotations for the purchase or sale when possible, and without advertising for bids or otherwise complying with the requirements of competitive bidding. All quotations obtained shall be kept on file for a period of at least one year after receipt thereof. Municipalities may, as a best value alternative, award a contract for construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance work to the vendor or contractor offering the best value under a request for proposals as described in Minn. Stat. §16C.28, Subd. 1, paragraph (a), clause (2) and paragraph (c).
 - (c) If the amount of the contract is estimated to be \$25,000 or less, the contract may be made either upon quotation or in the open market, in the discretion of the governing body. If the contract is made upon quotation it shall be based, so far as practicable, on at least two quotations which shall be kept on file for a period of at least one year after their receipt. Alternatively, municipalities may award a contract for construction, alteration, repair, or maintenance work to the vendor or contractor offering the best value under a request for proposals as described in Minn. Stat. §16C.28, Subd. 1, paragraph (a), clause (2).
 - (d) Support documentation of the bidding process utilized to contract services must be included in the grantee's financial records, including support documentation justifying a single/sole source bid, if applicable.
 - (e) For projects that include construction work of \$25,000 or more, prevailing wage rules apply per; Minn. Stat. §§177.41 through 177.44 consequently, the bid request must state the project is subject to prevailing wage. These rules require that the wages of laborers and workers should be comparable to wages paid for similar work in the community as a whole. A prevailing wage form should accompany these bid submittals.

5 Conditions of Payment

All services provided by the Grantee under this grant contract must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of the State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law.

6 Authorized Representative

The State's Authorized Representative is <u>Rodmen Smith</u>, <u>Director</u>, <u>Enforcement Division – Central Office</u>, <u>Minnesota Department of</u> <u>Natural Resources (DNR)</u>, 500 Lafayette Rd., St. Paul, MN 55155-4047, (651) 259-5052, rodmen.smith@state.mn.us</u> or his/her successor, and has the responsibility to monitor the Grantee's performance and the authority to accept the services provided under this grant agreement. If the services are satisfactory, the State's Authorized Representative will certify acceptance on each invoice submitted for payment.

The Grantee's Authorized Representative is the County Sheriff or designee. If the Grantee's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this grant agreement, the Grantee must immediately notify the State.

Assignment, Amendments, Waiver, and Grant Agreement Complete

- 7.1 Assignment. The Grantee shall neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this grant agreement without the prior written consent of the State, approved by the same parties who executed and approved this grant agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.2 Amendments. Any amendments to this grant agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original grant agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.3 Waiver. If the State fails to enforce any provision of this grant agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to enforce it.
- 7.4 Grant Agreement Complete. This grant agreement, including Exhibits "A" and "B," contains all negotiations and agreements between the State and the Grantee. No other understanding regarding this grant agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8 Liability

The Grantee must indemnify, save, and hold the State, its agents, and employees harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the State, arising from the performance of this grant agreement by the Grantee or the Grantee's agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies the Grantee may have for the State's failure to fulfill its obligations under this grant agreement.

State Audits

Under Minnesota Statute § 16B.98, Subdivision 8, the Grantee's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of the Grantee or other party relevant to this grant agreement or transaction are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this grant agreement, receipt and approval of all final reports, or the required period of time to satisfy all state and program retention requirements, whichever is later.

10 Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property

10.1 Government Data Practices. The Grantee and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statute § 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this grant agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Grantee under this grant agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statute § 13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Grantee or the State.

If the Grantee receives a request to release the data referred to in this Clause, the Grantee must immediately notify the State. The State will give the Grantee instructions concerning the release of the data to the requesting party before the data is released. The Grantee's response to the request shall comply with applicable law.

11 Workers' Compensation

The Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minnesota Statute § 176.181, Subdivision 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. The Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered State employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of these employees and any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of these employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

12 Publicity and Endorsement

- 12.1 **Publicity**. Any publicity regarding the subject matter of this grant agreement must identify the State as the sponsoring agency and must not be released without prior written approval from the State's Authorized Representative. For purposes of this provision, publicity includes notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared by or for the Grantee individually or jointly with others, or any subcontractors with respect to the program, publications, or services provided resulting from this grant agreement.
- 12.2 Endorsement. The Grantee must not claim that the State endorses its products or services.

13 Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue

Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this grant agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this grant agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

14 Termination

- 14.1 *Termination by the State.* The State may immediately terminate this grant agreement with or without cause, upon 30 days' written notice to the Grantee. Upon termination, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed.
- 14.2 *Termination for Cause.* The State may immediately terminate this grant contract if the State finds that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this grant contract, that reasonable progress has not been made or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.

14.3 Termination for Insufficient Funding. The State may immediately terminate this grant contract if:

a) It does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature

b) Or, if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the Grantee. The State is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. The State will not be assessed any penalty if the contract is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. The State must provide the Grantee notice of the lack of funding within a reasonable time of the State's receiving that notice.

15 Data Disclosure

Under Minnesota Statute § 270C.65, Subdivision 3, and other applicable law, the Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number, and/or Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state tax agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state tax laws which could result in action requiring the Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any.

Invasive Species Prevention

16

The DNR requires active steps to prevent or limit the introduction, establishment, and spread of invasive species during contracted work. The contractor shall prevent invasive species from entering into or spreading within a project site by cleaning equipment prior to arriving at the project site.

If the equipment, vehicles, gear, or clothing arrives at the project site with soil, aggregate material, mulch, vegetation (including seeds) or animals, it shall be cleaned by contractor furnished tool or equipment (brush/broom, compressed air or pressure washer) at the staging area. The contractor shall dispose of material cleaned from equipment and clothing at a location determined by the DNR Contract Administrator. If the material cannot be disposed of onsite, secure material prior to transport (sealed container, covered truck, or wrap with tarp) and legally dispose of offsite.

The contractor shall ensure that all equipment and clothing used for work in infested waters has been adequately decontaminated for invasive species (ex. zebra mussels) prior to being used in non-infested waters. 2016 STATE OF MINNESOTA FEDERAL BOATING SAFETY SUPPLEMENTAL EQUIPMENT GRANT AGREEMENT (CFDA #97.012)

1. The purpose of this grant is to provide supplementary funding to the Grantee, not exceeding the amount specified in Clause 4 of the Grant Agreement, to purchase the following specific equipment or other items that will be used for recreational boating safety activities:

- a. 16' boat, 75 hp motor & trailer
- b. Depth finder & installation
- 2. The program shall begin on October 1, 2016. The purchase and request for reimbursement (county invoice) must be submitted to the State's representative by January 31, 2017. An extension beyond that date for purchase, delivery and reimbursement deadlines may be granted, if requested by the Grantee, and approved in writing by the State's representative. Requests submitted after January 31, 2017, that have not been granted a purchase or reimbursement extension from the State, are not eligible for reimbursement and will become the Grantee's sole responsibility.
- 3. The Grantee must first purchase the item as specified in this grant, follow any specific county purchasing procedures and pay for it from the Grantee's funds. The Grantee must then submit the following for reimbursement by the deadline noted in #2 above:
 - a. An invoice from the Grantee, dated no earlier than October 1, 2016 or date grant is fully executed and not later than January 31, 2017, with a description of all the item(s) being requested for reimbursement. The purchase/invoice deadline may be modified if an extension, as noted in clause #2 above, is granted in writing from the State's representative.
 - b. A copy of the invoice(s) from the vendor(s) showing the amount the Grantee actually paid, including shipping, sales tax and any setup costs.
 - c. If the item is valued over \$5,000, the Grantee's asset number(s) & equipment serial number(s) must also be included on the invoice.

Grantees and subcontractors must follow Minnesota DNR's Operational Order 113, which requires preventing or limiting the introduction, establishment and spread of invasive species during activities on public waters and DNR administered lands. Enclosed for your review are the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office 2016 Federal Boating Safety Patrol Supplemental Grant hours, the supporting daily boating enforcement logs as completed by our deputies along with a summary of enforcement activity.

This 2016 boat & water season the deputies spent time assisting boaters, educating them and patrolling many lakes within Aitkin County. The deputies concentrated their efforts on the busy lakes and during the busier times of the season such as weekends and holidays. They patrolled some lakes where concerns or complaints were reported regarding unsafe boating.

The deputies spent 106.25 overtime hours on the area lakes this season. During those hours approximately 418 watercrafts were observed. Of those observed 98 were checked. There were 2 boating citations written which were both BWI, 16 written warnings and 2 verbal warnings issued. The deputies observed 42 PWC and checked 16 of those. The deputies issued 1 citation for a PWC which was a BWI, and 8 warnings with no verbal warning documents.

Due to flooding this 2016 season I believe the boat counts may have been down due to several of the lakes being listed as no wake zones for a period of time. There was great feedback from the community regarding the extra patrol which we were able to do because of this grant and we are very appreciative and grateful.

Budget Appropriation Request:

Aitkin County CARE, Inc. (CARE) is respectfully requesting an appropriation from Aitkin County for \$45,900. General operating funds will account for \$37,900 and the additional \$8000 will be utilized to offset the current Homemaking Clients who are at the lowest level of the sliding scale fee schedule.

In 2014, CARE identified a need for affordable homemaking services in Aitkin County in order to help seniors stay in their homes. Homemaking services consist of light house cleaning, meal preparation, shopping/errands, as well as some assistance with bathing & personal care. CARE received a one-time grant from the Mardag Foundation that allowed the implementation of Homemaking services. The program has allowed seniors to stay in their homes and growth has been tremendous. Part of that growth has proven to be a double-edged sword. While the need for those at the lowest level of the sliding fee scale has been great, the growth has been slower to acquire those at the upper end to offset the costs.

We were operating at a deficit following the end of the grant in 2015 and the loss of a couple of high usage clients. We have since rectified the situation by increasing the match requested of our new clients and are taking a balanced approach to providing services on the sliding fee schedule so that it will be self-sustaining. Additionally, we have launched and advertised "Cleaning with CARE" as a cleaning service available to the general public to generate revenue that will offset the cost of services to our seniors. We currently have 11 seniors receiving homemaking services at the rate of \$5 an hour. The additional funds will cover those seniors for duration of their services. No new clients will be added at that rate.

In 2015, CARE expanded its programs to offer Medicare Counseling. Care Consultants received training in order to provide counseling for those persons who become Medicare eligible during the year and to assist those who want to make changes during open enrollment. In addition to individualized counseling, CARE has hosted quarterly education events for Medicare eligible persons and their families. CARE receives no funding for the Medicare Counseling as it is a voluntary program, however based on client comments; the assistance is both appreciated and needed in Aitkin County.

Financial Information:

Since its inception, CARE has managed to diversify its funding streams, including an increase of revenue from fees for service. Some grants for general operational support were not applied for and/or not received in 2015 and the first quarter of 2016. A confluence of circumstances with the transition of multiple executive directors and an absence of an executive director for approximately three months; have contributed to the CARE reserves being significantly depleted. In the past three months, additional funding is in process and grants pending.

The Funding Request for CARE:

At CARE, we are hoping that the Board would consider adding \$8000 to the proposed allocation of \$37,900 for a total of \$45,900 for 2017. The additional \$8000 would be to cover seniors who

are at the lowest levels of the sliding scale fee schedule who are not eligible for a waiver program. The seniors who are just above the financial threshold would possibly require additional care in an alternate setting should the services no longer be available. We believe with the extra funds we can keep many safely in their homes for a longer duration.

Aitkin County Broadband Development Grant

Overview: It is our intent to partner with existing internet service providers to provide high speed internet access to as much area in Aitkin County as possible. The purpose of this grant fund is to incentivize private investment in the Aitkin County broadband infrastructure.

Purpose: Aitkin County is striving to have as many of our citizens, businesses and institutions to have access to high speed broadband internet. Currently, areas of Aitkin County are experiencing growth in the broadband infrastructure; the purpose of this grant to assist private broadband providers to reach areas in Aitkin County that otherwise would not be part of planned broadband infrastructure investments.

Availability of Funds, required match:

Aitkin County is providing \$150,000.00 per year in funding for the Aitkin County Broadband Development Grant for the years 2017, 2018, 2019. Applicants can apply for all or some of the total amount available. Aitkin County reserves the right to not award any grants and or to offer a pro-rated amount if more than one qualified application is received. Applicants must provide, at a minimum, a match equal to or greater than the grant amount requested.

Criteria of Aitkin County Broadband Development Grant:

The goal of this grant program is to fund those projects that will provide internet access at the State of Minnesota established speeds of 10Mbps down and 5Mbps upload. Aitkin County will consider projects that do not immediately meet those guidelines but demonstrate they will be scalable to meet those speeds in the future. A Fiber to the Home (FTTH) network is most desired by Aitkin County; projects that are not FTTH but can meet the guidelines will be eligible. Applications that demonstrate the ability to meet the State of Minnesota guidelines of 10Mbps down and 5Mbps up, ability to provide service to the largest number of households and offer the ability to be scalable up to even higher speeds will receive the most consideration in the awarding of grant funds. Any broadband development Grant. However, most consideration will be given to those projects that provide service to areas of Aitkin County that either do not have adequate coverage nor will not have adequate coverage in the near future.

Eligible Program Costs:

Aitkin County Broadband Development Grant Program can be used for infrastructure deployment costs for a qualifying project. "Broadband deployment costs" or "costs" mean the cost of the acquisition and installation of middle-mile and last-mile infrastructure that support broadband service.

Construction of broadband infrastructure may include any of the following: project planning; obtaining construction permits; construction of facilities, including construction of both "middle mile" and "last mile" infrastructure; equipment; and installation and testing of the broadband service.

Leverage of State of Minnesota or other broadband funding sources:

Aitkin County Broadband Grants funds can be used to match State, Federal or other public or private funding as those funding sources allow. Though it is our desire that additional funds be leveraged by this grant, it is not a requirement to receive Aitkin County Broadband Grant funds.

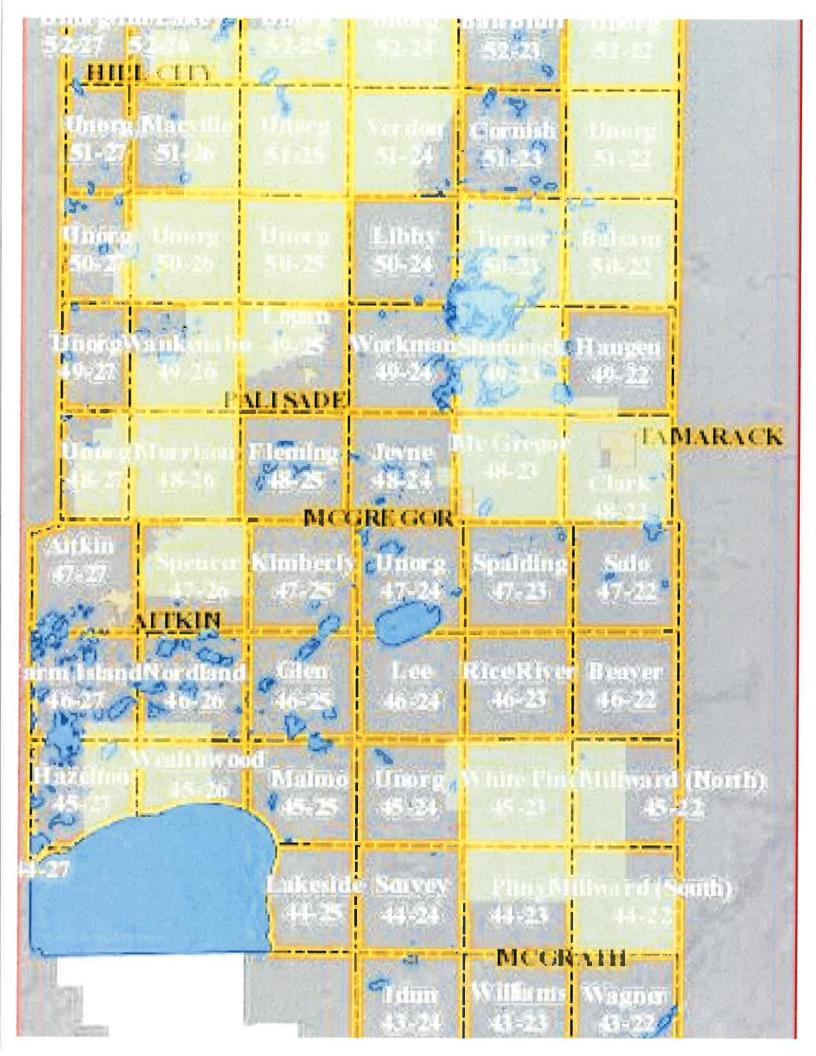

Dear Mr. Wussow:

As a follow up to our meeting on Thursday, October 6th we are submitting this proposal for design services. The intent of the services in this proposal is to continue the development of option B. Option B is the demolition of the west annex and constructing a new government services addition to the west and a new secured entry between the historic courthouse and the new addition. As discussed in the meeting on October 6th continuing with the design and planning steps at this point will help in meeting an ultimate schedule of either bidding the project in spring or fall of 2017.

The steps planned and tentative dates for this initial design phase are as follows:

- 1. Obtain existing site survey from the County Engineering department
- 2. Prepare a preliminary floor plan showing all proposed department layouts, including offices, workstations, work areas, storage, reception counters, etc.
- 3. Meet with departments, individually to review the proposed space layouts for their specific departments. (October 27, 2016)
- 4. Building Committee meeting to review the plans and information from the managers meeting. (October 27, 2016)
- 5. Plan revisions from initial managers and building committee meetings
- 6. Prepare site plan and proposed building elevations
- 7. Meet with departments, individually to review the revised floor for their specific departments. (November 17, 2016)
- 8. Building Committee meeting to review the plans and information from the managers meeting. (November 17, 2016)
- 9. Prepared updated site and floor plans and exterior elevations
- 10. Work with Contegrtity Group to review project budget
- 11. Building Committee meeting to review the final plans, elevations and estimate. (December 8, 2016)

This scope of work will allow the project to continue and resolve a number of items that will need to be done in the project process. This will allow the project to proceed with the County resolves some of the next steps prior to complete project authorization. The services in this phase will be of value no matter when

the project might occur and will be money well spent to negate possible project inflation cost of waiting to construct the project in 2019.

Our proposed fee for this scope of professional services is \$20,800.

Do you operate a commercial aquaponics or hydroponic business or only provide consultation services? Please describe. We operate a 3,200 square foot demonstration aquaponics farm called "Flourish Farm" in North Denver, which produces produce and fish for commercial sale and also provides a platform for R&D, training, and education programs.

We are co- located at The GrowHaus, a community service non- profit organization, sharing an additional 3,000 square feet of hydroponic lettuce production, which is sold "live" to local grocers in clam-shell packaging with full HACCP compliance.

We are the contract operator of a new 6,000 square foot tilapia- based aquaponics system which we designed, built, and commissioned for the Mental Health Center of Denver's (MHCD) new Dahlia Campus in North Denver. There is a brief mention of this facility, and our partnership with MHCD at:

Have you provided services to locations in a similar climate to that found in Northern Minnesota? If so, please describe. Colorado is a high, dry, variable climate environment. We have provided design/build, consulting (including feasibility studies), and advisory services to clients state- wide (and elsewhere in the USA and overseas in other climate zones) in locations where the temperatures can reach over 100F in the summer, and -30F in the winter, and at altitudes ranging from 5,000 ft to over 10,000 ft elevation. Jim Frasché, our Director of Farm and Business Solutions, has done extensive research on high altitude, cold climate aquaponics systems and greenhouses, and managed a small (12' X 40', 480 square feet) demonstration aquaponics system at the Denver Housing Authority Sustainability Park for more than two years which employed proprietary heating and cooling systems, and evaluated methods for minimizing frost line encroachment beneath the greenhouse. While the Minnesota climate will set important limitations on your ability to operate a successful installation, because of your northern location, seasonal variations in the availability of sunlight will also be an important determinant in operating systems and enclkosure design, as well as crop selection.

Please describe the type of consultation your company can provide to assist our planning committee with the information necessary to provide an informed decision regarding the development of a commercial aquaponics program. For the purpose of discussion, we will use the term "aquaponics" to imply both aquaponics and hydroponics, because your RFP refers to both. The outcome of the feasibility study will likely point to one of these systems as being most likely to meet your goals with differing risk factors, depending on your overall project goals, and we will evaluate the relative merits of both for your project.

We have experience in feasibility analysis and business planning for start-ups for both nonprofit and for- profit enterprises. Since you mention "commercial business" in your earlier question, our assumption is that your project is to be a profit making enterprise which seeks both a positive operating Profit and Loss Statement as well as the recovery of investment capital.

Our first step is to understand your goals and objectives, the project site, the proposed scale of operations, and the local markets. We use an extensive confidential Questionnaire which we will provide to you to help us understand the current status of your project planning and development.

Based on our understanding of the limited goals expressed in this RFP, we propose our consultation to comprise the following elements, which would require a visit to your location (included in the budget):

- We will review your planning and budgeting documents relating to the project by phone and email, and will respond with our detailed Questionnaire for your completion. We will follow up with your designated project contact to clarify or complete it,.
- One Colorado Aquaponics (CA) staff member (Jim Frasche, whose resume is attached, for your reference) will visit your location to review and clarify any remaining Questionnaire responses with you, conduct site evaluation (if a site has been selected), identify market opportunities, and evaluate fish and crop choices which would be most appropriate for your markets and location.
- We will conduct market research to identify and understand demand for your fish and produce. We will seek to define what products you should produce, what the possible volume is for each product to be sold, who will buy them, at what price per piece or per pound, and at what time of year. We will develop a conceptual growing platform design which will result in estimates of productivity for the selected fish species and crops, and this combined data will provide the basis for the income side of the balance sheet.
- Based on the above, we can develop an initial enclosure and general operating systems design concept budget, including both the structure and general component selection, for developing the operating cost side of the P&L Statement, including labor requirements. Bringing together this income and expense data will give you an understanding of the proposed project's financial operating performance down to EBITDA (Earnings Before Interest, Taxes, Depreciation, and Amortization).
- Based on the above, we will present a business case that will help you to understand the financial viability and performance of the project.
- We will provide an electronic Final Report .pdf file, and propose that we present the Report to you via teleconference. The report will emphasize:

a. Comparative Pro-Forma P&L Statements for aquaponics and hydroponics, with an explanation of underlying market, technical, and financial assumptions and risk factors in the proposed business cases,

- b. Identification of information and data which we were unable to complete in the scope of this Report and which will have an impact on the suspense of the project.

- c. Presentation of comparative risks associated with aquaponic and hydroponic production,
- d. Basic conceptual designs for both aquaponic and hydroponic growing systems,
- e. Recommendations for start-up scale and incremental increases in capacity,
- f Explanation of required technical and management skills to operate a successful greenhouse based aquaponic or hydroponic food business,
- g. Presentation of greenhouse and other possible alternatives as a growing environment,
- h. Presentation of acceptable chemical and biological characteristics of water resources,
- i. Presentation of electrical requirements and demand,
- j. Basic recommendations for fish and vegetable processing, packaging, and handling,
- k. Identification of support infrastructure requirements and site considerations, and a specific evaluation of your selected site, if you have selected a site, and
- I. Outline recommended next steps for moving to the next phase of decision making.

What are your costs for the development of a feasibility study? Please describe the expected outcomes of your feasibility study.

The cost of the feasibility study is \$6,500, including the cost of one site visit by CA staff. Our normal payment terms are 50% of the contract amount paid on signing our Agreement or Contract, and the remaining 50% to be paid on submission of our Final Report. This will leave \$1,000 from your grant to engage technical assistance, should you wish to proceed to the next phase, to work with a greenhouse manufacturer and understand local site preparation and construction costs under local code requirements, which is not included in the scope of this proposal.

By presenting the specific Report contents listed above, the expected outcome will be your understanding of core financial, technical, and market metrics that influence feasibility and risk, enabling you to make a business- like, analytically- based decision as to whether or not to go to the next stage of business development.

Please provide a timeline for the completion of the study. The feasibility study could be prepared over a 30 to 60 day period, depending on when the Contract is signed, deposit payment received, and work is authorized to begin. Scheduling and availability of our staff will depend on business already in progress with other clients. We believe we could complete the work before the end of the year. The completion schedule will also depend on the timeliness and completeness of your Questionnaire responses, and availability of your staff to meet with the CA staff at your location at the time of his visit, and your participation as described below.

At the conclusion of this engagement, the Aitkin County MN Aquaponics Project is requesting a written report that addresses the following questions:

What are the pros and cons of operating an aquaponics business vs. a hydroponics business? What recommendations would you provide to a startup company?

What are the practical considerations that should be considered as we determine the next steps in our decision making process?

What type of construction do you recommend for a start-up program? What is an ideal square footage building, and how do you build to ensure continued expansion opportunities?

What is the market potential for the Aitkin area, and how much of the market can be captured?

Please provide examples or realistic profit/loss statements and explain the assumptions used to determine these conclusions.

What type of infrastructure is recommended for ample water supply and electrical needs? Are these better secured with city utilities, or can a rural area offer an adequate supply of water, electricity and other utility needs?

What additional services or resources can your organization provide in the next stages of our planning process?

All of these questions will be addressed in the final report. We will submit a written Final Report, and also can provide a presentation of the Report via online teleconference.

Projects of this nature are typically approached in phases with each major phase being dependent on the results of the previous phase. We can provide support in all these phases:

Concerning your question about the size of the Aitken market, and the possibility for you to control some volume or segment of this market:

It is a great question, and at the core of the income side of a projected Profit and Loss Statement. We advocate a business model based on meeting existing demand, rather than generally trying to create new demand for something new-to-market that you will grow, at least as a startup. Our staff will take the opportunity on his visit to your location to understand local consumption patterns, and therefore demand for your products, by visiting local food stores like Paulbeck's and Gramma's Pantry, for example, to see what is actually on the shelves, what the prices are, and gather additional information about seasonal costs and seasonal preferences, if any. He will also visit restaurants, the casino, tourist facilities, and other operations serving food. and try to interview owners and chefs/cooks as time allows in an effort to identify and understand seasonal consumption patterns. This is important, because both aquaponics and hydroponics are basically production management opportunities, offering the possibility to produce crops that command the highest prices in the "off" seasons, with rapid turnover. We would like to know, literally, who eats salad, for example, and whether it is just a summer dish. What produce do people eat in the winter? What are the relative perceptions of the various fresh water fish species available, and is there an opportunity to grow one of the same species and sell it fresh, rather than frozen, or should we consider a different variety?

We would like to think that we can draw on your resources on your website to introduce us to your community members who know something about what people eat, and what they pay for it. Can you give legitimacy and credibility to our staff by introducing him to local businesses, like grocers, which will benefit as potential customers of your project? As another example, are there seasonal farmers' markets, can we identify the farm stand operators, and are they available and willing to talk about the prices they charge for their produce?

It would be good to know if there are existing studies available through any of the resources listed on your website (or the University of Minnesota, your sponsor) relating to food consumption, dietary patterns, market segmentation by food "quality" descriptors like "local" and "organic", or related issues that would be helpful to us in identifying and targeting the higher profit consumer markets for you. You have a fairly homogeneous population, and any state-wide data would be useful. Clearly, while there is a variety of market segments in your community, ranging from a casino to restaurants and fishing/hunting camps, the range is limited, and we want to identify and evaluate niche markets and opportunities for higher value products.

As a startup, it is unlikely that you would begin operating at a scale beyond the size of the market, or ever reach a scale where you would out - pace demand, unless the chosen crops to produce are not consistent with market preferences. The real questions relate to what you can grow profitably for targeted markets which will buy every piece of every product you produce, day after day, and to design a growing platform and production management strategy that targets this demand in a consistent, high quality way. Hydroponics and aquaponics are basically a type of automated farming- you do not want to accumulate inventory of perishable products. You will want to brand and position your business as a reliable, safe, quality conscious grower that your customers can depend on.

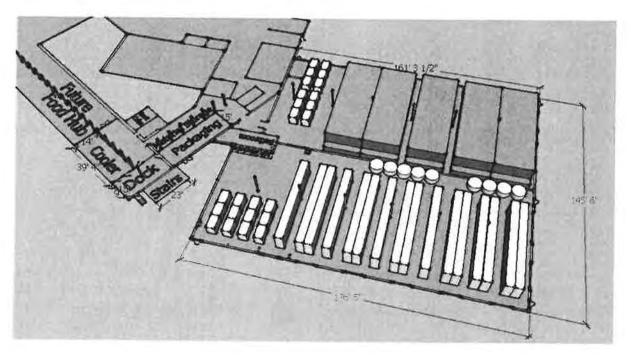

Agreement for Consulting Services

1. Names

This agreement is between «First_Name» «Last_Name», (Client), and Nelson and Pade, Inc., a Wisconsin corporation (Consultant).

2. Services to be performed

Consultant agrees to perform the following services for Client:

Consultant will conduct a project plan for the purpose of planning, designing and organizing the construction of an integrated aquaponic system to be located in the «City», «State» area. The proposed greenhouse will be approximately «Square_Footage» square feet. The purpose will be for the production of fresh fish and vegetables in an aquaponic system. The proposed facility will include a primary aquaponic growing system for commercial crop production, a crop packing area, fish nursery and plant propagation area.

In addition to offering recommendations on the environmental control and aquaponic culture systems, issues such as power, water source, existing infrastructure, market demands, labor required and business potential will be addressed. A written project plan report will be delivered to the Client upon completion of the project planning services.

The written Project Plan Report will include the following topics: Introduction and Project Overview; Industry History; Facility Overview; Proposed Aquaponic System; Environmental Control Requirements, Greenhouse Recommendations; Crop Recommendations; Marketing Considerations; Bio-Security and Food Safety; Site Considerations and Recommendations; Infrastructure Considerations; System Installation Requirements and Time Frame; Staff and Labor Requirements; Estimated Project Costs (aquaponic systems, materials, specialists, contractors, etc); Estimated Income and Estimated Operating Expenses; General Comments; Conclusions;

This agreement may be modified only by a written agreement signed by the parties.

If one party waives any term or provision of this agreement at any time, that waiver will be effective only for the specific instance and specific purpose for which the waiver was given. If either party fails to exercise or delays exercising any of its rights or remedies under this agreement, that party retains the right to enforce that term or provision at a later time.

18. Severability

If any court determines that any provision of this agreement is invalid or unenforceable,

any invalidity or unenforceability will affect only that provision and will not make any other provision of this agreement invalid or unenforceable and such provision shall be modified, amended or limited only to the extent necessary to render it valid and enforceable.
