Project Name: Wi-Fi Hotspot in Jacobson Community Center

Project Description:

This project will place a 25mbps Wi-Fi hotspot in the Jacobson Community Center. This is an area with very little to no broadband availability, the Jacobson Community Center hosts many local events and is a East Central Regional Library remote site. The Wi-Fi should get good use by locals, area visitors and Mississippi River users.

Who else will be involved in this project?

• Jacobson Community Center Board

What are the goals of your project:

• To provide a Wi-Fi hotspot in Jacobson. This project utilizes the same Satellite service that Long Lake Conservation Center used prior to fiber being installed and was very successful at LLCC. At the Community Listening Session, Wi-Fi in communities was a desired goal.

What are some strategies for achieving those goals:

• Signage in the area and along the Mississippi River will let area residents and visitors know about the service. Signage in the building will be placed throughout.

What are the desired outcomes? At the end of the project, what will be different, better, more or less of?

 There are no high-speed access points in the Jacobson area, coupled with the amount of use that the Community Center gets, there will be access to Wi-Fi for many folks who wouldn't otherwise have it. This grant will provide 36 months of service, after the 36 months, the Jacobson Community Center will be responsible for either continuing or discontinuing the satellite service.

How will you measure the success of your project?

Jacobson Community Center will provide usage numbers annually, if possible a counter will be installed.

Budget:

36 months of 25mbps at \$100.00 per month for a total grant of \$3,600.00. In-Kind cash and labor and signage \$750.00 Total project cost: \$4,350.00
