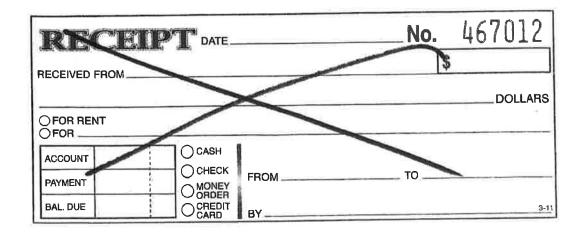

EASEMENT

Pursuant to the authority given to the undersigned County Auditor of Aitkin County, by the County Board of said County of Aitkin, as set forth in their resolution adopted by the County on November 9, 2021 to Lake Country Power of 26039 Bear Ridge Drive, Cohasset, MN 55721, a perpetual easement to construct and maintain a single-phase overhead powerline utility easement across the following Aitkin County managed lands:

The easement is described as follows:

A 40-foot-wide easement for utility purposes over, under and across the South 40 feet of the North 55 feet of the West 100 feet of the East Half (E ½) of Government Lot Three (3), Section Four (4), Township Fifty-two (52) North, Range Twenty-six (26) West, of the Fourth Principal Meridian, according to the Government Survey thereof on file and of record in the office of the County Recorder, Aitkin County, Minnesota.

and,

WHEREAS, said applicant will be charged \$2,400 for the easement and timber charges as appraised by the County Land Commissioner, and

WHEREAS, the Aitkin County land Commissioner, after making an investigation of such application, has advised that he finds no objection to granting such permit and easement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 282.04, Subdivision 4, the County Auditor be and is hereby authorized to issue to Lake Country Power of 26039 Bear Ridge Drive, Cohasset, MN 55721, a perpetual easement to use said strips of land, if consistent with the law, as in the special conditions set forth herein,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said easement be granted, subject to the following terms, and conditions:

- The communication infrastructure shall be constructed and maintained by the grantee or permittee without any cost to the County of Aitkin and the land area shall be open for public use, as long as said easement is in force.
- 2. Any timber cut or destroyed shall be paid for at the usual rate as soon as determined by the Land Commissioner. (Timber within ROW has been included in the easement costs.)
- 3. Aitkin County manages County owned and tax-forfeited lands to produce direct and indirect revenue for the taxing districts. This management includes the harvesting and extraction of timber, gravel, minerals, and other resources. The issuing and use of this easement shall not adversely affect the management and harvesting of timber and other resources on County owned and tax forfeited land. If for any reason, including township or county road construction or reconstruction, the easement needs to be relocated, the county and township will not be responsible for any relocation costs.
- 4. Any such easement may be canceled by resolution of the County Board for any substantial breach of its terms or if at any time its continuance will conflict with public use of the land, or any part thereof, on

which it is granted, after ninety (90) days written notice, addressed to the record owner of the easement at the last known address.

- 5. Land affected by this easement may be sold or leased for any legal purpose, but such sale or lease shall be subject to this easement and excepted from the conveyance or lease, while such easement remains in force.
- 6. Failure to use the right of way described in this document for the purpose for which this easement is granted for a period of five years, shall result in the cancellation of this easement and any rights granted to the grantee by this easement shall cease to exist and shall revert to the grantor.
- 7. Aitkin County manages the old railroad right of way for many purposes such as a motorized and non-motorized recreation trail, access to county managed and other lands for resource management purposes, including the harvesting of timber, extraction of gravel, peat, fill dirt, etc., and the mining and extraction of minerals. The issuing and use of this easement shall not adversely affect any other Aitkin County authorized uses of this strip of land.
- 8. During construction and/or laying of the fiber optics line, the lessee shall keep the traveled area of the old railroad grade clear of slash, trees, and dirt mounds. The lessee shall post and sign the area where constructing so that other users of this trail on the old railroad right of way are notified and aware of the construction work.
- 9. After construction, the lessee shall mark the location of the fiber optics line and shall return the land to the same condition as prior to issuing of the easement.
- 10. 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AGREEMENT

This Agreement, entered into on January 1, 2022, between Aitkin County Board, hereinafter referred to as the "Employer", and Local Union No. 49, International Union of Operating Engineers, hereinafter referred to as the "Union".

ARTICLE 1 UNION RECOGNITION

Section 1.1 The Board hereby recognizes Local Union No. 49, International Union of Operating Engineers, as the exclusive representative of all employees of the Aitkin County Road & Bridge Department who are employed for fourteen (14) or more hours per week or for more than sixty-seven (67) working days per calendar year, excluding supervisory employees, confidential employees, and the County Engineer, for the purposes of collective bargaining with respect to rates of pay, hours of work, and other conditions of employment as per certification by the State Bureau of Mediation Services dated November 21, 1989 as defined in Case No. 90-PCL-3018.

Section 1.2 In recognition of the Union as the exclusive representative, the Employer shall deduct from the pay of all employees an amount sufficient to provide payment of dues established by the Union from the wages of all employees expressly authorizing, in writing, such a deduction. The Employer shall remit such deduction to the appropriate designated officers of the Union.

The Union agrees to indemnify and hold the Employer harmless against any and all claims, suits, orders or judgments brought or issued against the Employer as a result of any action taken or not taken by the Employer under the provisions of this section.

ARTICLE 2 DEFINITIONS

<u>Section 2.1 Permanent Employee</u>: For purposes of this Agreement "permanent employee" means an employee hired for a position other than temporary or seasonal.

<u>Section 2.2 Employee</u>: For purposes of this Agreement, "employee" means an employee considered as a public employee as defined by PELRA.

<u>Section 2.3 Seasonal Employee</u>: For purposes of this Agreement, "seasonal employee" means a temporary employee hired to cover increased workloads in the department due to peak business demands.

<u>Section 2.4 Temporary Employee</u>: For purposes of this Agreement, "temporary employee" means an employee hired for a pre-established period of time which may not exceed sixty-seven days in a one calendar year period or 100 days if a student as defined in PELRA. Temporary employees work standard hours but are not seasonal. Temporary and seasonal employees are not eligible for benefits as defined under this Agreement.

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ARTICLE 3 MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

Section 3.1: The management of Aitkin County and the direction of working forces, including the right to direct, plan and control the County's operations, to hire, recall, transfer, promote, demote, suspend, discipline, and discharge employees for good and sufficient reason, to lay off employees because of lack of work or for other legitimate reasons, to introduce new and improved operating methods and/or facilities, to manage the County, and perform any inherent managerial functions not specifically limited by this agreement, are vested exclusively in the County Board of Commissioners. The Employer agrees that in the exercising of these rights, it will not alter this Agreement.

<u>Section 3.2:</u> Any term or condition of employment not specifically established or modified by this Agreement shall remain solely within the discretion of the Employer to modify, establish or eliminate.

ARTICLE 4 HOURS

Section 4.1 Normal Hours: The regular workday for employees shall be eight (8) hours. The regular workweek for employees shall be forty (40) hours, Monday through Friday.

<u>Section 4.2 Summer Hours</u>: Before May 15th of each year, the Employer will decide when members of the Road & Bridge Department will go to Summers Hours, which constitute ten (10) hours per day, Monday through Thursday, from approximately June 1st to September 30th. For those employees on Summer Hours, overtime is defined as all hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours per day, or forty (40) hours per week. Holidays are computed at ten (10) hours, and if a *Major Holiday* falls on a Friday or Saturday, the preceding Thursday shall be considered the holiday. *Major Holidays are defined in Section 5.2.*

The County Engineer will determine Summer Hours for any employee hired after January 1, 1999 within the Road & Bridge Department.

<u>Section 4.3 Overtime Pay</u>: Overtime is defined as all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day or the employee's regular work day if other than eight (8) hours or forty (40) hours per week, and for all hours worked on Saturday, Sunday and legal Holidays, or days observed as Holidays.

Overtime for all employees shall be paid as it is earned at the rate of time and one-half (1-1/2) cash payment. An employee who works on the calendar day on which a Major Holiday falls shall be paid at double time rates. An employee who works on the day observed as a Major Holiday shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half (1-1/2) the employee's regular rate of pay.

<u>Section 4.4 Call Back</u>: A permanent employee called back to work after completing the regular work day, or called out on a day off, shall receive a minimum of four (4) hours compensation at the overtime rate.

<u>Section 4.5 Overtime Distribution</u>: Overtime assignments shall be distributed fairly by classification and shop location. Overtime status will be reviewed quarterly.

<u>Section 4.6 Compensatory Time</u>: An employee working overtime shall have the option of electing compensatory time off in lieu of overtime at the time and one-half (1-1/2) rate subject to the following conditions:

- A. Compensatory time can be accumulated up to a maximum of fifty (50) hours.
- B. Prior approval of the County Engineer shall be necessary before using compensatory time.
- C. Compensatory time off shall be taken consistent with the needs of the department.

<u>Section 4.7 Rest Periods</u>: There shall be a fifteen (15) minute break in the a.m. and a fifteen (15) minute break in the p.m. of a working day for all employees covered under this Agreement.

<u>Section 4.8 Work Location</u>: The Employer may assign an employee to report in the employee's own vehicle to a shop location of equal or less distance than the employee's normal reporting shop location.

ARTICLE 5 HOLIDAYS

<u>Section 5.1</u>: All permanent employees shall be entitled to the following holidays (8-hour holidays, unless provided otherwise in Article 4, Section 4.2 or noted below):

New Year's Day Independence Day Friday after Thanksgiving

Martin Luther King Day Labor Day Christmas Day

President's Day Veterans Day Memorial Day Thanksgiving Day

Christmas Eve 4 hours if the day falls on a Monday through Thursday

Permanent part-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees shall be entitled to holiday pay on a pro-rated basis.

<u>Section 5.2</u>: If a major holiday falls upon a Saturday, the preceding Friday shall be considered a holiday for all employees. If a major holiday falls upon a Sunday, the following Monday will be considered a holiday for all employees. The remaining holidays will be observed only when they fall within the regular workweek. The term "major holiday" is defined to include New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Veterans Day and Christmas Day.

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ARTICLE 6A VACATIONS

This VACATIONS Article 6A will expire on 1/29/2022, end of day, when PTO is implemented. Employee vacation banks will be transferred to their PTO bank on 1/30/2022.

<u>Section 6.1</u>: Full-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees shall be granted the following vacation schedule:

Section 6.2: Any vacation not taken in accordance with the above schedule will be allowed to accumulate up to one and one-half (1-1/2) times the employee's yearly vacation earned.

<u>Section 6.3</u>: Employees shall be allowed to take their vacation in accordance with their position on the seniority list according to classification. Accumulated vacation shall be paid upon termination unless the employee is terminated for an illegal act committed against the employer, or in event of the death of the employee, it shall be paid to the beneficiary.

Section 6.4: Any vacation will be accrued and utilized by the hour.

<u>Section 6.5</u>: Vacation leave may be taken consistent with the needs of the Department subject to the prior approval of the County Engineer or designee.

ARTICLE 6B PAID TIME OFF (PTO)

Section 6.1 Effective January 30, 2022 (reflected on the 2/25/2022 pay check), employees will receive PTO that will accrue on a per payroll period basis. Full-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees shall accrue PTO benefits based on the following table:

Effective January 1, 2023, employees who have used at least twelve (12) PTO days (96 hours) in the previous twelve-month period may elect pay in lieu of PTO for up to ten (10) days (80 hours) once in any calendar year. Such PTO cash out will not be counted as hours worked for the purpose of computing overtime.

Employees may accrue up to a maximum of 35 days (280 hours) PTO.

All PTO hours count as time worked for the purpose of overtime computation. (Holidays, comp time, personal leave, and extended sick bank hours do not count towards the computation of overtime, unless expressly provided otherwise in writing by this Agreement.)

Upon separation of service, the employee will be paid for any unused PTO, up to the maximum accrued amount, unless the employee is terminated for just cause. In the event of the death of an employee, the employee's accumulated PTO credits shall be paid to the employee's estate.

Employees are allowed to transfer any accrued PTO over the maximum accrual amount to the extended sick leave bank where there is no severance payment upon separation of service. At no time can the extended sick leave bank exceed 720 hours (90 working days)¹. PTO that has been transferred to the extended sick leave bank can only be used in accordance with the sick leave provisions in Article 6B, Section 6.2 (Extended Sick leave bank/Care of relatives).

Employees who have sick banks above 720 hours on January 1, 2022, will be allowed to use their sick leave bank until it falls below 720 hours, and then the 720 hour cap will apply. (Currently, Randy Thompson, Paul White, Florian Blaszak, and Carter Johnson's sick banks are above 720 hours.)

Part-time employees shall be entitled to PTO benefits on a pro-rated basis, up to a total of 40 hours PTO per calendar year, in accordance with county policy. Seasonal and temporary employees are not eligible to accrue PTO benefits.

PTO benefits shall only accrue when an employee is in a paid status or on an approved military leave. PTO benefits shall not be earned by any employee during a leave of absence without pay, suspension without pay, or time otherwise not paid.

In order to assure the orderly performance and continuity of services provided, employees wishing to schedule a vacation should request PTO as far in advance as reasonably possible, but usually at least one (1) week in advance of the requested vacation period. Requests for PTO usage shall be granted by the Department Head or designee unless it is determined that such absence would adversely affect and interfere with the orderly performance and continuity of services. It may be

necessary to limit the number of employees taking vacation at the same time or during an event or particular period of time. Such requests, however, shall not arbitrarily be denied. Requests for vacation will be processed giving preference to the order in which the requests are received. In the event requests are received at the same time for the same vacation period, then time-in-department will be the determining factor.

Probationary employees may use accrued PTO with supervisory approval.

Section 6.2. Extended Sick Leave Bank / Care Of Relatives (Willie, we can move this section to Article 8 when the final copy is drafted.)

Accrued sick leave may be used when an employee cannot perform work duties due to but not limited to the following: personal illness or injury; necessity for medical or dental treatment or examination, where such treatment cannot be scheduled outside of working hours; emergency, illness or injury of the employee's immediate family member which requires the employee's attendance and care; quarantine directed by a medical physician; disability; pre and postnatal care. For the purpose of this paragraph, immediate family is defined as; spouse, child, step child, adult child, parent, step parent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, or grandchild. To the extent that state statute (§181.9413) or regulations change, this policy shall be construed as consistent with those changes.

<u>Sick leave may be used because of illness of the employee's sibling or grandparent as well. For siblings and grandparents, use is limited to 160 hours all combined per calendar year.</u>

An employee must notify the employee's supervisor of sick leave usage prior to the employee's starting time, unless an emergency prevents the employee from doing so. Failure to give such notice may be cause for disciplinary action.

The County reserves the right to require written medical certification from an employee.

In the event of three (3) consecutive days of absence or in cases of the repeated and systematic absence of an employee the Department Head or Supervisor may require a medical statement from an appropriate medical authority before granting sick leave, as well as verification that an employee is able to perform the duties of employment before the employee is allowed to return to work.

ARTICLE 7 HEALTH & WELFARE INSURANCE

<u>Section 7.1 Health and Welfare</u>: Aitkin County Road and Bridge Department employees will participate in the Operating Engineers Local #49 Health and Welfare Fund. Permanent employees eligible are those individuals who are members of the Operating Engineers Local #49 and fair share permanent employees, and all new probationary permanent employees who are and will be working 30 or more hours per week on average.

Since the eligibility for coverage of insurance in the benefit fund is on a quarterly basis beginning September 1, December 1, March 1 and June 1, Aitkin County may pro-rate the sum on a monthly basis required to acquire health insurance for the new employee entering into the bargaining unit of Local #49. Upon any employee in this unit terminating his/her employment or going into retirement, Aitkin County will pro-rate and withhold any monies that have been paid for his or her insurance coverage beyond employee termination or retirement date from their last payroll earnings including any fringe benefits due and owing said employee upon termination. The County will withhold the amount equal to the employee's cost share as per current agreement.

Coverage starts on the first of the month following date of hire.

The Employer's contribution toward the total premium for group insurance shall be as follows:

Any additional amount due shall be paid by the employee through payroll deduction.

In the event the health insurance provisions of this Agreement fail to meet the requirements of the Affordable Care Act and its related regulations or cause the Employer to be subject to a penalty, tax or fine, the Union and the Employer will meet immediately to bargain over alternative provisions so as to comply with the Act and avoid any penalties, taxes or fines for the Employer.

<u>Section 7.2 Employee Contribution</u>: In no event will the County's contribution exceed the actual cost of the coverage.

Section 7.3 Life Insurance:

The County Board agrees to provide and pay for a life insurance policy of \$25,000 for all permanent employees and to provide life insurance coverage in the amount of \$15,000 for their spouse and dependents to age 26, subject to carrier restrictions.

Section 7.4 LTD and Other Voluntary Benefits

The Employer shall provide Long Term Disability Insurance reimbursement for full-time permanent employees in accordance with the Personnel Policy. Part-time employees are not eligible for LTD.

Full-time permanent employees shall have the option to purchase other voluntary benefits as offered by the Employer at the employee's cost in accordance with the terms of the policy between the Employer and insurance carrier.

ARTICLE 8 SICK LEAVE BENEFITS / CARE OF RELATIVES

ARTICLE 8, Section 8.1 Sick Leave will expire on 1/29/2022, end of day, when PTO and extended sick leave is implemented. Employees sick leave banks will be transferred to their extended sick leave bank on 1/30/2022.

<u>Section 8.1 Sick Leave:</u> Full-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees shall be credited with one (1) day (8 hours) of sick leave for each month worked. Sick leave shall be accumulated to a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) days (960 hours).

Accrued sick leave may be used when an employee cannot perform work duties due to but not limited to the following: personal illness or injury; necessity for medical or dental treatment or examination, where such treatment cannot be scheduled outside of working hours; emergency, illness or injury of the employee's immediate family member which requires the employee's attendance and care; quarantine directed by a medical physician; disability; pre and postnatal care. For the purpose of this paragraph, immediate family is defined as; spouse, child, step child, adult child, parent, step parent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, or grandchild. The County Engineer, at his/her discretion, may require a doctor's certificate showing the nature of an injury of illness.

Sick leave may be used because of illness of the employee's sibling or grandparent as well. For siblings and grandparents, use is limited to 160 hours all combined per calendar year.

Part-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees shall be entitled to sick leave pay on a pro-rated basis, up to a maximum of 40 hours.

Sick leave will be accrued and utilized by the hour.

<u>Section 8.2 Family and Medical Leave</u>: Eligible employees will be granted FMLA in accordance with County policy.

Section 8.3 Bereavement Leave: Full-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees will be allowed a maximum of three (3) days (24 hours) leave without loss of pay when a death occurs in an employee's family, which shall be construed in this section to mean spouse, life partner, child, step child, parent, step parent, sibling, step sibling, father-in-law, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, sister-in-law, brother-in-law, grandparents and grandchildren. Two (2) additional days (16 hours) may be allowed when extensive travel is necessary (greater than 250 miles one way), subject to the approval of the Employer. Additional time, if needed, may be allowed by the Employer, but such additional time in excess of the five (5) days (40 hours) provided above shall be charged against the employee's sick leave.

Part-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees employed 20 or more hours per week on average shall be entitled to <u>bereavement</u> leave on a pro-rated basis.

Temporary and seasonal employees shall not be eligible for <u>bereavement</u> leave benefits.

<u>Section 8.4 Workers' Compensation</u>: Worker's Compensation will be administered in accordance with county policy.

Deleted: Temporary and seasonal employees shall not be eligible for funeral leave benefits.¶

ARTICLE 9 PERSONAL LEAVE

Full-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees shall be granted nine (9) hours of personal leave each quarter, and may accumulate up to 36 hours of personal leave at any given time. Personal leave may be taken consistent with the needs of the department subject to the prior approval of the County Engineer or designee. Personal leave is not paid out upon termination of employment or death.

Part-time (probationary and non-probationary) employees shall be entitled to personal leave on a pro-rated basis. Seasonal and temporary employees are not entitled to personal leave with pay.

ARTICLE 10 SENIORITY

<u>Section 10.1</u>: A policy of Seniority shall be formulated that will give permanent employees with longer periods of service an opportunity for promotion and also give all employees a feeling of security.

- A. There shall be a seniority list established which shall include the Maintenance Department, based on the employee's original date of hire.
- B. There shall be a seniority list established which shall include the Engineering Department, based on the employee's original date of hire.
- C. There shall be a seniority list established which shall include all permanent employees of the Road and Bridge Department, based on the employees' original date of hire.

Section 10.2: New employees shall be on a six (6) month probationary period.

Employees who transfer or promote to a new position would serve a three (3) month trial period. During the trial period, the employer can return the employee to their previous position and rate of pay. The trial period may be extended one additional month by mutual agreement.

<u>Section 10.3</u>: In the event of lay off due to lack of work, employees with the least seniority shall be first to be laid off, then permanent employees with the least seniority shall be laid off, and in the event of rehire, the last permanent employee laid off shall be the first to be rehired. No permanent employee shall be laid off out of turn on the seniority list, according to classification.

<u>Section 10.4</u>: In the event of a job opening, the job shall be announced by bulletin and the most senior permanent qualified employee shall be given first opportunity to step up for promotion.

Whenever employees are hired, comparable work experience and/or qualifications may be recognized in which the beginning wage may be set at the appropriate pay level allowing for the number of years experience and comparable employment.

Section 10.5: Seniority shall be deemed broken if an employee:

- A. Quits or is discharged.
- B. Is laid off for a period exceeding one year.
- C. Is on medical leave of absence for a period exceeding one (1) year, providing that a review will be made by the County at the end of that year.
- D. Fails to report for work at the end of a leave of absence.
- E. Fails to accept a recall from layoff.

Section 10.6: Seasonal employees will be used under the following conditions:

- A. Between the months of May 1 through December 1.
- B. Salaries for the first sixty-seven (67) days will be set by Board policy. Salaries after sixty—seven (67) days will be set out in Wage Appendix A.
- C. Seasonal employees will not displace permanent full time employees from their usual and customary work.

ARTICLE 11 GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

<u>Section 11.1 Definition of Grievance</u>: A grievance is defined as a dispute or disagreement as to the interpretation or application of the specific terms and conditions of this Contract. It is specifically understood that any matters governed by statutory provisions shall not be considered grievances and subject to the grievance procedure hereinafter set forth.

<u>Section 11.2 Organization Representatives</u>: The Employer will recognize employee representatives designated by the exclusive representatives as the grievance representatives of the bargaining unit having the duties and responsibilities established by this Article. The exclusive representative shall notify the Employer in writing of the names of such employee representatives and of their successors when so designated.

Section 11.3 Processing of Grievance: It is recognized and accepted by the exclusive representative and the Employer that the processing of grievances as hereinafter provided is limited by the job duties and responsibilities of the employees and shall therefore be accomplished during normal working hours only when consistent with such employee duties and responsibilities.

The aggrieved employee and the employee representative shall be allowed a reasonable amount of time without loss of pay when a grievance is investigated and presented to the Employer during normal working hours, provided the employee and employee representative have notified and received the approval of the designated supervisor who has determined that such absence is reasonable and would not be detrimental to the work programs of the Employer.

<u>Section 11.4 Procedure</u>: Grievances, as defined by Section 1, shall be resolved in conformance with the following procedure:

Step 1. An employee claiming a violation concerning the interpretation or application of this Contract shall within twenty-one (21) calendar days after such alleged violation has occurred present such grievance to the employee's immediate supervisor. The immediate supervisor will meet and discuss the grievance within ten (10) working days and give an answer to such Step 1 grievance within ten (10) working days after the meeting. A grievance not resolved in Step 1 and appealed to Step 2 shall be placed in writing setting forth the nature of the grievance, the facts on which it is based, the provision or provisions of the contract allegedly violated, the remedy requested, and shall be appealed to Step 2 within ten (10) working days after the immediate supervisor's final answer in Step 1. Any grievance not appealed in writing to Step 2 by the union within ten (10) working days shall be considered waived.

Step 2. If appealed, the written grievance shall be presented to the Department Head and a meeting date set within ten (10) working days. The Department Head shall give the union the Employer's Step 2 answer in writing within ten (10) working days after meeting on such Step 2 grievance. A grievance not resolved by the final Step 2 answer shall be appealed to Step 3 by the union within ten (10) working days after the Department Head's final answer in Step 2. Any grievance not appealed to Step 3 by the union within ten (10) working days shall be considered waived.

Step 3. If appealed, the written grievance shall be presented to the Human Resources Manager and a meeting date set within ten (10) working days. The Human Resources Manager, in cooperation with the County Administrator, shall give the union the Employer's Step 3 answer in writing within ten (10) working days after meeting on such Step 3 grievance. A grievance not resolved by the final Step 3 answer may be appealed in writing to Step 4 by the union within ten (10) working days after the Employer's final answer in Step 3. Any grievance not appealed in writing to Step 4 by the union within ten (10) days shall be considered waived.

Step 3A. If the Employer and the Union mutually agree, a grievance unresolved in Step 3 and appealed to Step 4 may be submitted to the Minnesota Bureau of Mediation Services for mediation within ten (10) working days after receipt of the Employer's final answer in Step 3. If the grievance is submitted to mediation and is resolved, the settlement shall be reduced to writing and signed by both the Employer and the Union. If the grievance is submitted to mediation and is not resolved, it may be appealed to Step 4 within ten (10) working days of the date of the mediation meeting.

Step 4. A grievance unresolved in Step 3, or Step 3A if applicable, and appealed to Step 4 shall be submitted to arbitration subject to the provisions of the Public Employment Labor Relations Act of 1971, as amended. The selection of the Arbitrator shall be made in accordance with the "Rules Governing Arbitration of Grievance" as established by the Minnesota Bureau of Mediation Services.

Section 11.5 Arbitrator's Authority:

- A. The arbitrator shall have no right to amend, modify, nullify, ignore, add to or subtract from the terms and conditions of the contract. The arbitrator shall consider and decide only the specific issues submitted in writing by the Employer and the Employee, and shall have no authority to make a decision on any other issue not so submitted.
- B. The arbitrator shall be without power to make decisions contrary to or inconsistent with or modifying or varying in any of the applications of laws, rules or regulations having the force and effect of law. The arbitrator's decision shall be submitted in writing within thirty (30) days following the close of the hearing or the submission of briefs by the parties, whichever be later, unless the parties agree to an extension. The decision shall be based solely on the arbitrator's interpretation or application of the express terms of this Contract and to the facts of the grievance presented.
- C. The fees and expenses for the arbitrator's services and proceedings shall be borne equally by the Employer and the exclusive representative provided that each party shall be responsible for compensating its own representative and witnesses. If either party desires a verbatim record of the proceedings, it may cause such a record to be made, providing it pays for the record. If both parties desire a verbatim record of the proceedings, the cost shall be shared equally.

Section 11.6 Waiver: If a grievance is not presented within the time limits set forth above, it shall be considered "waived". If a grievance is not appealed to the next step within the specified time limit or any agreed extension thereof, it shall be considered settled on the basis of the Employer's last answer. If the Employer does not answer a grievance or an appeal thereof, within the specified time limits, the employee may elect to treat the grievance as denied at that step and immediately appeal the grievance to the next step. The time limit in each step may be extended by mutual agreement of the Employer and the employee in any step.

Section 11.7 Choice of Remedy: If as a result of the written Employer response in Step 3, the grievance remains unresolved and if the grievance involves the suspension, demotion or discharge of an employee who has completed the required probationary period, the grievance may be appealed either to Step 4 of this Article 11 or a procedure such as veterans preference or fair employment. If appealed to any procedure other than Step 4 of this Article 11, the Union and the aggrieved employee shall indicate in writing which procedure is to utilized -- Step 4 of Article 11 or another appeal procedure -- and the employee shall sign a statement to the effect that the choice of any other hearing precludes any subsequent appeal through Step 4 of this Article 11, except that with respect to statutes under the jurisdiction of the United States Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, an employee pursuing a statutory remedy is not precluded from also pursuing an appeal under this grievance procedure.

ARTICLE 12 WAGES

Section 12.1 Rate of Pav:

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Effective January 1, 2022, employees covered by this Agreement shall be paid in accordance with Appendix A_x Employees whose wage is below the maximum of the appropriate pay range will receive 5% within range movement, not to exceed the maximum.

Effective January 1, 2023, employees covered by this Agreement shall be paid in accordance with Appendix A. Employees whose wage is below the maximum of the appropriate pay range will receive 5% within range movement, not to exceed the maximum.

Effective January 1, 2024, employees covered by this Agreement shall be paid in accordance with Appendix A. Employees whose wage is below the maximum of the appropriate pay range will receive 5% within range movement, not to exceed the maximum.

In no event shall an employee's wage be adjusted to exceed the maximum of the appropriate salary range.

All employees shall remain at their rate of pay at the expiration of this Agreement until a new Agreement is executed by the parties.

Employees who terminate employment prior to the date of County Board approval of this Agreement shall not be eligible for retroactive wage adjustments.

Section 12.2 Pay Period: All employees covered by this Agreement shall be paid according to county policy.

<u>Section12.3 Reclassification</u>: A permanent employee who works 50% or more at a higher job classification in a calendar year shall be eligible for reclassification.

An employee whose job classification is upgraded will be placed on the step in the new pay range that results in at least a \$0.75 per hour increase.

<u>Section 12.4</u>: Permanent employees shall not be reduced in pay scale when assigned work of a lower classification. Employees performing work of a higher pay classification shall receive the wage scale prevailing for the higher classification.

Section 12.5: Insofar as seniority lists are established in the respective departments, so should the right to determine applicable contract clauses rest with those persons directly affected by said clauses; that is to say that personnel in the Road and Bridge Department and Engineering Department should exercise complete control insofar as approving those items in this contract which directly apply to them, that is wage rates. This clause in no way attempts to circumvent or subdivide the Local Union. It merely attempts to place responsibility directly on those individuals affected by the various clauses.

<u>Section 12.6 Jury Duty</u>: All permanent employees shall be paid full wages when called for jury duty. Permanent employees will reimburse to the County the amount of wages they receive as jury duty pay, not to exceed the employee's regular day's pay.

1/1/2021 A special one-time Lump Sum payment to employees named below who are at the wage scale maximum <u>and</u> not getting a step increase in 2021. (The combined value of the adjustments shall not exceed \$5,512. The dollars will be divided amongst the following active employees on January 1, 2021 - Florian Blaszak, Allen Lundquist, Paul White, Randy Flier, David Jackman, Duane Kraemer, Randy Thompson. For example, if there are 7 active employees, each will receive a one-time lump sum payment of \$787.42. Or, if there are 6 active employees, each will receive a one-time lump sum payment of \$918.66. Etc.)

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Section 12.7 Military Pay: Employees will receive military leave in accordance with state and federal statutes.

<u>Section12.8</u>: For newly created job classifications, the County will notify the Union ten (10) days in advance of posting to negotiate a rate of pay for the new job classification.

ARTICLE 13 SAFETY

The County agrees to furnish all necessary safety equipment including, but not limited to, safety regulated and/or reflective outerwear, footwear^{1,2}, gloves and safety glasses for the protection of their employees, and the employees shall use the equipment when necessary.

¹Effective January 1, 2022, each member will receive an allowance of up to \$145.00 per calendar year to be used specifically towards safety footwear.

²Effective January 1, 2023, each member will receive an allowance of up to \$195.00 per calendar year to be used specifically towards safety footwear.

ARTICLE 14 DISCIPLINE

<u>Section 14.1</u> Disciplinary action, including oral reprimand, written reprimand, suspension without pay, demotion, or discharge, may be imposed upon an employee for just cause. Any disciplinary action imposed may be processed as a grievance through the grievance procedure outlined in Article 11. Oral reprimands may not be processed beyond Step 3 of the grievance procedure.

<u>Section 14.2</u>. Employees have a right to make a clear request for union representation before or during an investigatory interview if the discussion could in any way lead to their being disciplined or terminated.

ARTICLE 15 DISCHARGE AND LOUDERMILL HEARING

This Article 24 shall pertain to discharge cases only.

Section 15.1. An action to discharge an employee shall be taken by the appointing authority only after a Loudermill Hearing has been held between the designated Union representative and employee, and the County Administrator. The employee and the Union shall be given written notice of the charges against the employee and of the Loudermill Hearing date and time at least ten (10) calendar days prior to the meeting. The Union and the employee shall be present at the meeting, and the Union shall present information relevant to the proposed discharge and may present witnesses and evidence. The County Engineer and/or Human Resources Director shall

have the right to present information, witnesses and evidence at the meeting. This meeting shall be in lieu of Steps 1 and 2 of the Grievance Procedure set forth in Article 11 of this Agreement.

<u>Section 15.2.</u> In the event the appointing authority proceeds to discharge, then a grievance relating to discharge shall be filed at Step 3 of the Grievance Procedure within ten (10) working days of the date of the discharge action.

ARTICLE 16 SAVINGS CLAUSE

This Agreement is subject to the laws of the United States, the State of Minnesota, and the County. In the event any provision of this Agreement shall be held contrary to law by a court of competent jurisdiction from whose final judgment or decree no appeal has been taken within the time provided, or is contrary to an administrative ruling or is in violation of legislation or administrative regulations, such provision shall be voided. All other provisions of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect. The voided provision may be renegotiated at the request of either party.

ARTICLE 17 DURATION

This grant contract agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through the Department of Employment and Economic Development, Business and Community Development Division, (STATE) and Aitkin County, 307 2nd St., Aitkin, MN 56431, Federal Tax ID # 41-6005749 ("GRANTEE").

Recitals

- 1. Under Minn. Stat. 116J.401 the State is empowered to enter into this grant.
- 2. The State is in need of non-entitlement and entitlement units of local government to administer the Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) grant.
- 3. The funds are intended to provide grant funds for eligible Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) activities that assist communities, particularly low to moderate income communities, in preventing, preparing for, and responding to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.
- 4. The Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all activities and duties described in this grant contract agreement to the satisfaction of the State.

Grant Contract Agreement

1 Terms of Grant Contract Agreement

- 1.1 Effective date: August 9, 2021, or the date the State obtains all required signatures under Minn. Stat.§16B.98, Subd. 5, whichever is later. Per Minn. Stat.§16B.98, Subd. 7, no payments will be made to the Grantee until this grant contract agreement is fully executed. Per 24 CFR 570.489 the Grantee may receive reimbursement for approved expenses that occurred prior to the execution of this grant contract agreement.
- 1.2 Expiration date: March 1, 2024, or until all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled, whichever occurs first.
- 1.3 Survival of Terms. The following clauses survive the expiration or cancellation of this grant contract agreement:
 8. Liability; 9. State Audits; 10. Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property; 12. Publicity and Endorsement; 13. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue; 15. Data Disclosure; 16. Duplication of Benefits; 29. Program Income.

2 Grantee's Duties

2.1 Duties, Deliverables, and Completion Dates. The Grantee, who is not a state employee, will: Comply with required grants management policies and procedures set forth through Minn. Stat. §16B.97, Subd. 4 (a) (1).

The Grantee has made application to the State for the purpose of administering CDBG-CV projects in the manner described in Grantee's "APPLICATION," which is incorporated into this grant contract agreement by reference.

The Grantee is awarded funds to provide financial assistance to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. The activities must satisfy the benefit of low to moderate income households/persons or an urgent need national objective. These activities may include public service, retrofitting buildings, commercial rehabilitation, and broadband development.

Specific grantee activity will be detailed and set forth in Clause 4.1(a).

2.2 Provisions for Contracts and Sub-grants.

- (a) Contract Provisions. The Grantee must include in any contract and sub-grant, in addition to provisions that define a sound and complete agreement, such provisions that require contractors and sub-grantees to comply with applicable state and federal laws. Along with such provisions, the Grantee must require that contractors performing work covered by this grant be in compliance with all applicable OSHA regulations, especially the federal Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response Standards (29 CFR 1910.120 and 29 CFR 1926.65).
- (b) Ineligible Use of Grant Funds. (Not applicable to CDBG-CV) The dollars awarded under this grant contract agreement are grant funds and shall only be used by Grantee or awarded by Grantee to third parties as grant funds and cannot take the form of a loan under any circumstance. Grantee shall not use, treat, or convert the grant funds into an interest-bearing loan, a non-interest-bearing loan, a deferred loan, a forgivable deferred loan or any other type of loan. Further, Grantee shall include in any contract or sub-grant awarding the grant funds to a third party all the provisions and requirements of this grant contract agreement, including the requirement that these dollars are grant funds only and cannot be used, treated or converted into any type of loan.
- (c) Job Listing Agreements. Minn. Stat. § 116L.66, subd.1, requires a business or private enterprise to list any vacant or new positions with the state workforce center if it receives \$200,000 or more a year in grants from the State. If applicable, the business or private enterprise shall list any job vacancy in its personnel complement with MinnesotaWorks.net at www.minnesotaworks.net as soon as it occurs.
- (d) Payment of Contractors and Subcontractors. The Grantee must ensure that all contractors and subcontractors performing work covered by this grant are paid for their work that is satisfactorily completed.

3 Time

The grantee must comply with all the time requirements described in this grant contract agreement. In the performance of this grant, time is of the essence. Request for contract extension will not be permitted.

4 Compensation and Payment

- **4.1 Consideration.** The State will pay for all services performed by the Grantee under this grant contract agreement as follows:

(b) Travel Expense (does not apply to CDBG-CV)

Reimbursement for travel and subsistence expenses actually and necessarily incurred by the Grantee or the

project's designated administrative agency, if applicable as a result of this grant contract agreement will not exceed \$0.00; provided that the Grantee will be reimbursed for travel and subsistence expenses in the same manner and in no greater amount than provided in the current "Commissioner's Plan" promulgated by the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB). The Grantee will not be reimbursed for travel and subsistence expenses incurred outside Minnesota unless it has received the State's prior written approval for out of state travel. Minnesota will be considered the home state for determining whether travel is out of state.

- (c) Total Obligation. The total obligation of the State for all compensation and reimbursements to the Grantee under this grant contract agreement will not exceed \$4,823,654.00.
 - (i) **Pre-award Costs**. Grantee may incur reimbursable administrative costs prior to the fully executed grant contract agreement, but only after the CDBG-CV award letter has been released. This would include work on the environmental clearance, producing rehabilitation policies and procedures, and costs associated with attending SCDP implementation training.
 - (ii) Eligible Costs. Eligible costs include the costs identified in the Section 4.1 (a) of this Grant Contract Agreement that are incurred during the contract period and are also eligible for the CDBG program.

4.2 Payment

(a) Invoices. The State will promptly pay the Grantee after the Grantee presents an acceptable itemized invoice for the services actually performed, and the State's Authorized Representative accepts the invoiced services. Invoices must be submitted timely and according to the following schedule:

Payment requests will be processed on a bi-weekly calendar basis with the calendar being provided by the State. The total amount of grant funds requested must be two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more in each payment request. The final payment request, and payment requests made in the two-week periods prior to June 30 and September 30 of each year, may be under \$2,000.

The State has authority to withhold payment of administrative funds if adequate progress on contractual goals is not being met.

(b) Federal Funds. Payments under this grant contract agreement will be made from federal funds obtained by the State through CFDA number 14.228, Title 1 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1974 through a special allocation of Community Development Block Grant funds which was authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economy Security Act (CARES Act), Public Law 116-136. Federal Award number B-20-DW-27-0001. The Grantee is responsible for compliance with all federal requirements imposed on these funds and accepts full financial responsibility for any requirements imposed by the Grantee's failure to comply with federal requirements.

Funds made available pursuant to this grant contract agreement shall be used only for expenses incurred in performing and accomplishing such purposes and activities during the grant period described above. Notwithstanding all other provisions of this grant contract agreement, it is understood that any reduction or termination of Housing and Urban Development funds provided to the State may result in a reduction to the Grantee.

Where provisions of the Grantee's Application are inconsistent with other provisions of this grant contract agreement, the other provisions of this grant contract agreement shall take precedence over the provisions of the Application.

- (c) Unexpended Funds. The Grantee must promptly return to the State any unexpended funds that have not been accounted for annually in a financial report to the State due at grant closeout.
- **4.3** Contracting and Bidding Requirements. Per Minn. Stat.§471.345, grantees that are municipalities as defined in Subd. 1 must follow the law.
 - (a) Support documentation of the bidding process utilized to contract services must be included in the grantee's financial records, including support documentation justifying a single/sole source bid, if applicable.

- **(b)** For projects that include construction work of \$25,000 or more, prevailing wage rules apply per; Minn. Stat. \$\\$177.41 through 177.44 consequently, the bid request must state the project is subject to prevailing wage. These rules require that the wages of laborers and workers should be comparable to wages paid for similar work in the community as a whole. A prevailing wage form should accompany these bid submittals. In addition, for projects that include construction work of \$2,000 or more, Davis Bacon Act and Related Requirements noted in part 26 of this grant contract agreement will apply.
- (c) The Grantee must not contract with vendors who are suspended or debarred in MN: http://www.mmd.admin.state.mn.us/debarredreport.asp and https://www.sam.gov/SAM/.

5 Conditions of Payment

All services provided by the Grantee under this grant contract agreement must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of the State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law.

6 Authorized Representative

The State's Authorized Representative is Christian Nordeng, Grants Specialist, 1st National Bank Building, Suite E200, 332 Minnesota Street, St. Paul, MN 55101-1351, (651) 259-7455, christian.nordeng@state.mn.us, or his/her successor, and has the responsibility to monitor the Grantee's performance and the authority to accept the services provided under this grant contract agreement. If the services are satisfactory, the State's Authorized Representative will certify acceptance on each invoice submitted for payment.

The Grantee's Authorized Representative is The Honorable Mark Wedel, County Board Chairperson of Aitkin County, 307 2nd St, Aitkin, MN 56431, mark.wedel@co.aitkin.mn.us, or his/her successor. If the Grantee's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this grant contract agreement, the Grantee must immediately notify the State.

7 Assignment, Amendments, Waiver, and Grant Contract Agreement Complete

- **7.1** Assignment. The Grantee shall neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this grant contract agreement without the prior written consent of the State, approved by the same parties who executed and approved this grant contract agreement, or their successors in office.
- **7.2** *Amendments.* Any amendments to this grant contract agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original grant contact, or their successors in office.
- 7.3 Waiver. If the State fails to enforce any provision of this grant contract agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to enforce it.
- **7.4 Grant Contract Agreement Complete.** This grant contract agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the State and the Grantee. No other understanding regarding this grant contract agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8 Liability

The Grantee must indemnify, save, and hold the State, its agents, and employees harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the State, arising from the performance of this grant contract agreement by the Grantee or the Grantee's agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies the Grantee may have for the State's failure to fulfill its obligations under this grant contract agreement.

9 State Audits

Under Minn. Stat. § 16B.98, Subd.8, the Grantee's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of the Grantee or other party relevant to this grant contract agreement or transaction are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, and the General Accounting Office of the

U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this grant contract agreement, receipt and approval of all final reports, or the required period of time to satisfy all state and program retention requirements, whichever is later.

Accounting methods must be in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

The Grantee shall comply with the requirements of the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 (P.L. 104-156). When a Grantee expends over \$750,000 in federal funds during their fiscal year, an A-133 audit is required to be submitted for that year.

10 Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property

10.1 Government Data Practices. The Grantee and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this grant contract agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Grantee under this grant contract agreement. The civil remedies of Minn. Stat. §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Grantee or the State. If the Grantee receives a request to release the data referred to in this Clause, the Grantee must immediately notify the State. The State will give the Grantee instructions concerning the release of the data to the requesting party before the data is released. The Grantee's response to the request shall comply with applicable law.

10.2 Intellectual Property Rights.

- a) The State owns all rights, title, and interest in all of the intellectual property rights, including copyrights, patents, trade secrets, trademarks, and service marks in the works and documents created and paid for under this Grant Contract Agreement. The "works" means all inventions, improvements, discoveries (whether or not patentable), databases, computer programs, reports, notes, studies, photographs, negatives, designs, drawings, specifications, materials, tapes, and disks conceived, reduced to practice, created or originated by the Grantee, its employees, agents, and subcontractors, either individually or jointly with others in the performance of this Grant Contract Agreement. "Works" includes documents. The "documents" are the originals of any databases, computer programs, reports, notes, studies, photographs, negatives, designs, drawings, specifications, materials, tapes, disks, or other materials, whether in tangible or electronic forms, prepared by the Grantee, its employees, agents, or subcontractors, in the performance of this Grant Contract Agreement. The documents will be the exclusive property of the State and all such documents must be immediately returned to the State by the Grantee upon completion or cancellation of this Grant Contract Agreement. To the extent possible, those works eligible for copyright protection under the United States Copyright Act will be deemed to be "works made for hire." The Grantee assigns all right, title, and interest it may have in the works and the documents to the State. The Grantee must, at the request of the State, execute all papers and perform all other acts necessary to transfer or record the State's ownership interest in the works and documents.
- b) Whenever any invention, improvement, or discovery (whether or not patentable) is made or conceived for the first time or actually or constructively reduced to practice by the Grantee including its employees and subcontractors, in the performance of this Grant Contract Agreement, the Grantee will immediately give the State's Authorized Representative written notice thereof, and must promptly furnish the State's Authorized Representative with complete information and/or disclosure thereon.
- c) The Grantee must perform all acts, and take all steps necessary to ensure that all intellectual property rights in the works and documents created and paid for under this grant contract agreement are the sole property of the State, and that neither Grantee nor its employees, agents, or subcontractors retain any interest in and to the works and documents. The Grantee represents and warrants that the works and documents do not and will not infringe upon any intellectual property rights of other persons or entities. Notwithstanding Clause 8, the Grantee will indemnify; defend, to the extent permitted by the Attorney General; and hold harmless the State, at the Grantee's expense, from any action or claim brought against the State to the extent that it is based on a claim that all or part of the works or documents infringe upon the intellectual property rights of others. The Grantee will be responsible for payment of any and all such claims, demands, obligations, liabilities, costs, and damages, including but not limited to, attorney fees. If such a claim or action arises, or in the Grantee's or the State's opinion is likely to arise, the Grantee must, at the State's discretion, either procure for the State the right or license to use the intellectual property rights at issue or replace or modify the allegedly infringing works or documents as necessary and appropriate to obviate the

infringement claim. This remedy of the State will be in addition to and not exclusive of other remedies provided by

11 Workers' Compensation

The Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minn. Stat. §176.181, Subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. The Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered State employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of these employees and any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of these employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

12 Publicity and Endorsement

12.1 Publicity. Any publicity regarding the subject matter of this grant contract agreement must identify the State as the sponsoring agency and must not be released without prior written approval from the State's Authorized Representative. For purposes of this provision, publicity includes notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared by or for the Grantee individually or jointly with others, or any subcontractors, with respect to the program, publications, or services provided resulting from this grant contract agreement. All projects primarily funded by state grant appropriation must publicly credit the State of Minnesota, including on the grantee's website when practicable.

12.2 Endorsement. The Grantee must not claim that the State endorses its products or services.

13 Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue

Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this grant contract agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this grant contract agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

14 Termination

14.1 Termination by the State. The State may immediately terminate this grant contract agreement with or without cause, upon 30 days' written notice to the Grantee. Upon termination, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for activities satisfactorily performed.

14.2 Termination for Cause. The State may immediately terminate this grant contract agreement if the State finds that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this grant contract agreement, that reasonable progress has not been made or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.

14.3 Termination for Insufficient Funding. The State may immediately terminate this grant contract agreement if:

- (a) Funding for Grant No. CARE-21-0011-O-FY21 is withdrawn by United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- (b) Or, if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the Grantee. The State is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. The State will not be assessed any penalty if the contract is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. The State must provide the Grantee notice of the lack of funding within a reasonable time of the State's receiving that notice.

14.4 In the event of cancellation. In the event of any cancellation under this provision, the Grantee shall cooperate fully with the State and help facilitate any transition for the provision of services by a different vendor. Failure to cooperate with or withholding any information or records requested by the State or a different vendor that impairs in

any way the transition of the provision of services shall constitute a material breach of this grant contract agreement, subjecting Grantee to liability for all damages incurred by the State resulting from such breach.

15 Data Disclosure

Under Minn. Stat. § 270C.65, Subd. 3, and other applicable law, the Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number, and/or Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state tax agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state tax laws which could result in action requiring the Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any.

16 Duplication of Benefits, The Grantee must develop and maintain adequate procedures to prevent a duplication of benefits that address (individually or collectively) each activity. At a minimum the procedures must include a requirement that any person or entity receiving CDBG-CV that is determined duplicative will need to repay assistance with non-federal dollars, and include a method of accessing whether the use of CDBG-CV funds will duplicate financial assistance that is already received or is likely to be received by acting reasonably to evaluate need and the resources available to meet that need.

The CARES Act requires HUD to ensure that there are adequate procedures in place to prevent any duplication of benefits as required by section 312 of the Stafford Act, as amended by section 1210 of the Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018 (division D of Public Law 115-254; 42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.). Duplication of benefits occurs when Federal financial assistance is provided to a person or entity through a program to address losses resulting from a Federally-declared emergency or disasters, and the person or entity has received (or would receive, by acting reasonably to obtain available assistance) financial assistance for the same costs from any other source (including insurance), and the total amount received exceeds the total need for those costs.

17 Conflicts of Interest-Application Submittal

The State will take steps to prevent individual and organizational conflicts of interest in reference to Grantees per Minn.Stat.§16B.98 and Department of Administration, Office of Grants Management, Policy Number 08-01 Conflict of Interest Policy for State Grant-Making. When a conflict of interest concerning State grant-making is suspected, disclosed, or discovered, transparency shall be the guiding principle in addressing it.

In cases where a potential or actual individual or organizational conflict of interest is suspected, disclosed, or discovered by the Grantee throughout the life of the grant contract agreement, they must immediately notify the State for appropriate action steps to be taken, as defined above.

The Grantee must complete a Conflict of Interest Disclosure agreement and attach it to their proposal.

18 Debarment and Suspension Certification

(If applicable) The Grantee agrees to follow the President's Executive Order 12549 and the implementing regulation "Non-procurement Debarment and Suspension: Notice and Final Rule and Interim Final Rule," found at 53 FR 19189, May 26, 1988, as amended at 60 FR 33041, June 26, 1995, including Appendix B, "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion—Lower Tier Covered Transactions;" unless excluded by law or regulation. Evidence that contractors are not debarred will be maintained over the life of the grant.

Eligible Contractors: All Grantees are required to verify that all contractors, subcontractors, and sub-recipients are not listed on the Federal publication that lists debarred, suspended, and ineligible contractors. Evidence of this determination must be readily available to the State throughout the life of the project.

19 Conflict of Interest Screening

The Grantee must comply with the Conflict of Interest provisions of Minn. Stat. § 471.87 – 471.88 and Subpart K of 24 CFR, Part 570.611 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Grantee will screen for conflicts of interest in any activity that involves individual assistance and exceptions for participation for individual assistance must be approved by DEED.

20 Federal Environmental Standards

Unless the State indicates otherwise and prior to release of funds, the Grantee is required to conduct an environmental review on project activities to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA), as amended. Disbursement of funds from the State will not occur until State has issued an environmental clearance to the Grantee.

Grantee must maintain environmental review documentation and records and make them available to the public.

21 Drug-free Workplace/Drug-Free Workplace Awareness Program

The Grantee agrees to provide a drug free workplace by notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the Grantee's workplace and specifying actions that will be taken against employees for violation of such prohibition. The Grantee must have an Awareness Program, or establish a drug free workplace awareness program to inform employees about the dangers of drug abuse, the availability of drug counseling and penalties for violations of the drug free workplace policy. Prior to release of funds, Grantee will provide evidence of a drug-free workplace to the State. If applicable, all secondary communities involved with this project will adhere to this condition.

22 Prohibition of Excessive Force Policy

The Grantee agrees to adopt and enforce a policy to prohibit the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in nonviolent civil rights demonstrations (P.L. 101-144, Section 519). Prior to release of funds, Grantee will provide evidence of a Prohibition of Excessive Force Policy to the State. If applicable, all secondary communities involved with this project will adhere to this condition.

23 Residential Anti-displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan

The Grantee agrees to adopt, make public and follow a "residential anti-displacement and relocation assistance plan" in accordance with Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. This plan must include steps to minimize displacement of residents caused by project activities. Prior to release of funds, Grantee will provide evidence of a Residential Anti-displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan to the State. If applicable, all secondary communities involved with this project will adhere to this condition.

24 Fair Housing

The Grantee agrees to abide by and promote all Fair Housing Regulations during the grant period, including conducting at least one unique activity to affirmatively further fair housing each year that the grant remains open. Activities must be reported via the State's Annual Report each year.

25 Policies and Procedures

Where applicable and prior to release of funds, the Grantee must approve and maintain policies and procedures which are consistent with the Application and consistent with current SCDP guidance and policy. All policies and procedures must adhere to federal and/or state requirements.

26 Federal Labor Standards

When applicable, the Grantee must comply with all federal Davis Bacon and Related Act requirements (DBRA). The Grantee must follow DEED's "12 Step Instructions" that are available on the SCDP portion of the DEED website in order to comply with DBRA. Grantee must submit the DEED "Notice of Contract Award" to DEED staff within 14 days of each contract award where DBRA applies and before using grant funds to pay contractors or subcontractors. For projects involving Broadband Development and Retrofitting building projects, copies of the first payroll for each contractor and/or subcontractor working on the project will be provided to DEED staff for review before any cash disbursements for the activity are issued by the State.

27 Use of Out of State Contractors

The Grantee must comply with Minnesota Statutes, Section 290.9705 by either:

- A. Depositing with the State, eight percent of every payment made to non-Minnesota construction contractors, where the contract exceeds \$50,000; or
- B. Receiving an exemption from this requirement from the Minnesota Department of Revenue.

28 Reporting

The Grantee shall submit reports annually during the grant period to the State by October 15, or the date designated by the State. In addition, recipients of \$150,000 or more of CDBG-CV funds must submit, no later than 7 days after the end of each calendar quarter a quarterly report to the State. Quarterly reports must be in accordance with the reporting requirements set forth in Section 15011 of the CARES Act. Grantee shall use the reporting forms provided by the State.

29 Program Income

Program income generated using CDBG-CV grants will be treated as annual formula CDBG Program Income. Program Income is defined as any income equal to or exceeding \$35,000 in a federal fiscal year (October 1-September 30) received by the Grantee from repayments on deferred or installment loans made from CDBG-CV grants. Any income received from these grants that total less than \$35,000 in a federal fiscal year, is not Program Income, but must be reused for a Small Cities Development Program (SCDP) approved purpose. Eligible activities funded by funds generated from CDBG-CV activities do not need to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19. Total Program Income expenditures for the year must be reported on the expenditures section of the annual report. Program Income must all be used before SCDP will provide a payment request form, if applicable.

Grantee agrees to have a "SCDP Income Reuse Plan" on file that states how Program Income and other funds generated from the grant will be reused. This plan should prescribe that funds will be reused for an approved SCDP purpose and be consistent with the Grantee's Application. If the funds received by the Grantee cannot be utilized by the Grantee within a reasonable amount of time, the State may request the funds be returned.

Annual Post Closeout Program Income Reporting: Following grant closeout, the Grantee must report Program Income to the state by October 15 of each year. Reporting must include Program Income:

- Funds received during the federal fiscal year,
- Expended during the federal fiscal year, and the funds
- Balance at the end of the federal fiscal year.

This reporting will be completed online using the "Post Closeout Online Reporting" and if applicable the "Post Closeout Program Income Expenditure Reporting Form" located on the DEED/SCDP website. These forms can be found on this webpage: http://mn.gov/deed/government/financial-assistance/community-funding/.

Grantees should track Program Income (\$35,000 or more received in a fiscal year) and other income from CDBG-CV grants (under \$35,000 in a year) with separate accounts. These funds do not include Minnesota Investment Funds.

Refer to SCDP A-Z Guide for additional information.

30 Procurement

The Grantee must maintain documentation that shows that professional services were procured in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principals, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards. Services obtained from an HRA, RDC, or nonprofit organization do not have to be procured by competitive negotiation, but contracts for these services must only be on a cost reimbursement basis, accounted for in accordance with "The Common Rule."

All construction contracts will require competitive bidding, unless waived by the State.

31 Section 3 & Equal Opportunity

Grantee must adhere to the Subparts A, C and D of the Section 3 regulations at 24 CFR 75 if the financial assistance provided to the project exceeds a threshold of \$200,000 in HUD program funding. If the project is found to be a Section 3 project, requirements at 24 CFR 75.19 must be followed. The Grantee will report labor hours in the Annual Report as described in 24 CFR 75.25(a), provide the qualitative efforts to assist low and very low-income persons described at 24 CFR 75.25(b) if reporting benchmarks are not met, must include Section 3 requirements and language in bidding documents and contracts, and retain necessary Section 3 documentation as described in 24 CFR 75.31. Additionally, the Grantee will include The Standard Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Construction Contract Specifications (Executive Order 11246, as amended) in the bidding and contract documents. Grantees will

adopt an "Affirmative Contractor Outreach Plan – Section 3, MBE and WBE" which will outline how the Grantee will adhere to Section 3 requirements and will promote the use of Section 3 business concerns and Women- or Minority-Owned Businesses. The plan will include a requirement that contractors and subcontractors will complete the Section 3 and Women- or Minority-Owned Business Certification form.

32 Public Hearing

The Grantee will hold a second public hearing (first was held for submission of Application) that includes a citizen participation opportunity midway through the implementation period to solicit public feedback on grant progress and results. The public hearing must be publicly advertised and minutes from the hearing and evidence that the hearing was publicly advertised will be provided to the State, if requested. Documentation that the second public hearing was held will be made on the final report to DEED.

33 Record Retention

The Grantee will maintain all grant related records and files for six years after grant closeout.

34 Bid Specifications

For broadband development projects, the Grantee or administrating agency must provide the State with bid specifications (not maps or architectural drawings) for review and approval.

35 National Objectives

All activities outlined in the Grantee Application and table contained in 4.1(a) shall meet a National Objective as outlined by the CDBG-CV program.

36 Lead Based Paint

For activities that involves a building or space used for occupancy, the Grantee will follow the DEED lead policy.

37 Monitoring

The State shall monitor grantee performance as outlined in its Annual Action Plan to HUD. The Grantee will make all books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices accessible for any monitoring. Monitoring will be based on forms provided by the State. The monitor may be in person or a request for information at any time during the grant and any time after grant closeout as needed.

The Grantee will monitor the activities of the sub-recipient according to 2 CFR §200.303 and 2 CFR §200.331 as necessary to ensure that the sub-award is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the Sub-award; and that sub-award performance goals are achieved. Pass-through entity monitoring of the sub-recipient must include:

- (a) Reviewing financial and programmatic reports required by the pass-through entity.
- (b) Following-up and ensuring that the sub-recipient takes timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies pertaining to the Federal award provided to the sub-recipient from the pass-through entity detected through audits, on-site reviews, and other means.
- (c) Issuing a management decision for audit findings pertaining to the Federal award provided to the sub-recipient 2 CFR §200.332 from the pass-through entity as required by 2 CFR §200.521 management decision.

Minnesota Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV)

Broadband Development Application

Minnesota Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) guidance is located on DEED website at https://mn.gov/deed/government/financial-assistance/community-funding/small-cities.jsp. This application packet is only for Broadband Development. Other eligible program component applications are available on the same website as the guidance.

The *Minnesota CDBG-CV* Program is designed to help non-entitlement and entitlement communities or counties to prepare, prevent, or respond to the health and economic impacts of COVID-19. The activities must be most critical to their locality and primarily for their low-and moderate-income residents.

The *Minnesota CDBG-CV* Program will be managed by the Office of Community Finance's Small Cities Development Program (SCDP) unit. Projects associated with this Broadband Development Application will be funded with CDBG-CV funding. This one-time program is specifically aimed to award funding for broadband development projects that assist qualified communities in preparing for, preventing, and responding to COVID-19. The *Border to Border Broadband Development Grant Program* managed by the Office of Broadband Development is a separate broadband development program. Those interest in that program are directed to visit the Office of Broadband Development webpage for more information.

Broadband Development Activities

Grantees may utilize funding to provide new or increased access to broadband to support telework, telemedicine, telelearning, and/or televisits. All activities must result in a National Objective by providing new or enhanced broadband infrastructure and or components to low-to-moderate income (LMI) persons/households. For activities installing broadband infrastructure, the National Objective is met on an area basis (LMA). Activities associated with service/communication enhancements must benefit LMI persons/households.

Total allocation of CDBG-CV funds available towards Broadband Development projects is \$25,468,807.24. The Broadband Development activities may request an assumed maximum of \$5,000,000 per project. Broadband Development project includes installation of broadband infrastructure and other broadband related activities (example: telelearning, nursing home virtual visits, and other approved telecommunicating activities).

Activity	Description
Installation of broadband infrastructure	Installation of broadband infrastructure in areas with either download/upload speeds under the State's goal or lacking broadband connectivity. Installation of infrastructure will enhance internet access to unserved and underserved areas to support the increased connectivity for telework, telemedicine, telelearning, and virtual visits/gatherings. Infrastructure may be in the form of last mile, middle mile, or tower installation. Last mile includes, but is not limited to, installation of lines to residential structures or nursing homes. CDBG-CV funding may be used towards the installation of main fiber lines, lines to towers and tower installation. Middle mile and tower installation will be allowed if last mile infrastructure will be included and will serve as the final leg in connecting the broadband network to end-users. Costs associated with the purchase of equipment for wireless broadband activities and broadband services are ineligible.
Communication Enhancements	Other broadband related activities include activities in addition to the installation of main broadband lines and towers. Installation of lines to commercial, industrial or public buildings are ineligible. Service payments and purchasing/installing of equipment to transmit or receive broadband service are also ineligible.

5. Describe the need for broadband infrastructure and how it benefits the overall community, in preventing, preparing for, or responding to COVID-19, within the service area. The response should include how the COVID-19 pandemic has increased the need for broadband infrastructure.

Access to broadband is as imperative today as electricity was 75 years ago. A reliable fiber optic network is the backbone necessary to provide rural resident access to the benefits of unlimited bandwidth, cost efficiency and reliability. Residents in our proposed project area do not have access to quality or affordable Internet service for everyday needs and essential services. Furthermore, in most areas of the proposed project it is not even an option for them to receive a wireline Internet service. The COVID-19 pandemic as shown that broadband is no longer a luxury utility, but a requirement. Distance learning is now the new normal, not just for K-12, but for colleges across the country. Telemedicine has emerged as a critical tool in healthcare to reach more patients and to help keep people safe. Without access to a broadband connection, neither of these are an option for those in the proposed project area.

The proposed project encompasses a vast area of land that is densely populated. The proposed project would include 85 miles of fiber and pass approximately 500 homes. The average cost per passing is close to \$10,000. Without funding this project will not happen and most likely this area of the county will remain unserved. If less than the amount requested is awarded, then the project would need to be reduced in sized to make economically feasible.

MLEC is completing a FTTH home project in 2021 that will be the network connection point to the proposed project area.

MLEC has marketing professionals experienced in working with the region's residents. MLEC has an additional advantage of being a trusted local provider of both electricity and fiber Internet to the area. MLEC currently has a 56% take-rate for all homes passed by the MLEC Fiber network.



MLEC and Aitkin County will work together to promote the award of the proposed grant project through the means of newspaper, newsletters, direct mailings, websites, and social media postings.

MLEC has a broadband promotion process in place that informs residents when a FTTH project will be coming to an area. Successful strategies include door-to-door neighborhood campaigns, as well as putting out yard signs promoting the availability of broadband in the area. MLEC will also promote the new service availability in the Cooperatives monthly newsletter, by direct mail, local newspaper announcements, and through social media.

In addition, MLEC has a fully functional website in place http://www.mlecmn.net to assist customers with plan selection, sign up and to find out if Broadband is available in their area.

Earlier in 2021, bids were opened for this same project with all bids subsequently rejected due to concerns with the bids. As shown on the attached abstract of bids, seven bids were received, with Kaski, Inc. - Duluth, MN submitting the low bid in the amount of \$289,827.90. With the cost of this contract estimated at \$244,142, the low bid is 18.71% above the estimated amount. Agreement Between the University of Minnesota And

Aitkin County

For providing Extension programs locally and employing Extension Staff

This Agreement ("Agreement") between the County of Aitkin, Minnesota ("County") and Regents of the University of Minnesota on behalf of its Extension unit, 240 Coffey Hall, St. Paul, Minnesota, 55108 ("University") is effective January 1, 2022, and supersedes and replaces any and all current or existing agreements relating to Extension and its programs that may exist between the County and University.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years, beginning on January 1, 2022 and ending on December 31, 2024, unless earlier terminated as provided in paragraphs 8 and 9.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. §38.34 authorizes a Board of County Commissioners to incur expenses and spend money for County Extension work; and

WHEREAS, the money set aside and appropriated by the County Board in the County Extension Fund may be paid out by orders of the University's Director of Extension, or the Director's designee, as identified in Minn. Stat. §38.36, Subd. 3; and

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. §38.37 provides that Extension educators must be employed according to University personnel procedures and must be University employees; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the County and University that the University shall provide Extension services on behalf of the County in exchange for considerations as detailed herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual undertaking and agreements contained within this Agreement, the County and University hereby agree as follows:

1. In accordance with Minn. Stat. §38.37 County desires to augment University's state-wide Extension programs. The programs that the County will augment are detailed in Table A below.

- 2. County recognizes that University costs for supporting these positions may increase from year to year. The costs payable for these positions are reviewed by the Association of Minnesota Counties' ("AMC") Extension Committee and University's Extension central administration, at which time the parties will agree on an appropriate inflation factor for the coming year(s). Unless County and University otherwise agree, the inflation factor will be as agreed to by AMC and University.
- 3. Based on the County's funding commitment, University will be responsible for providing salary & fringe benefits for the positions, enhanced programming from regional extension educator staff, program supervision, travel (mileage, meals, and lodging), in-service training within program area, payroll, and accounting services.

The County agrees to provide local support in the form of support staff, office space, office furnishings, telephone, computer, software, internet service,, storage space, and general office supplies. The University will recommend support staff responsibilities, technology needs and other office standards. Nevertheless, the level of availability and type of local support will be determined by the County as established in the annual budget.

- 4. University will bill the County on a quarterly basis and the County will submit payment within thirty-five (35) days of receipt of the bill. The total annual amount to be paid by the County shall be paid in four (4) equal quarterly payments.
- 5. During an extended leave of absence (e.g. FMLA; educational leave), the University will continue the program with regional educators and/or temporary employees with involvement and concurrence of the County, The County will be billed at the contract price and will not incur any additional charges for regional educators or temporary employees.
- 6. As vacancies occur (e.g. retirement, resignation), and if the County and University agree to continue to support the desired program and position, University will hire new personnel with involvement and concurrence of the County. The County will not be billed for a position during the time that position is vacant. If temporary employees are hired to continue the program during the hiring process, the County will be billed at the contract price.
- 7. The University will complete an annual performance evaluation of each University Extension employee working in the County and supporting the programs identified in paragraph 1. The County Extension Committee will have the option to provide input to University on such evaluation. The University in accordance with University personnel guidelines will determine salary adjustment of each University Extension employee.

- 8. Annually, the County Extension Committee, in coordination with University, will be responsible for approving the County Extension educational programming and services, as provided for in Minn. Stat. §38.34.
- 9. Nothing in this Agreement precludes the County or University at any time during the term of this Agreement from requesting a modification of the County Extension program, including an adjustment of the number of University Extension personnel working in the County. The County or University will provide a minimum of ninety (90) days prior notice if either party desires a change in programs that results in a decrease in the staffing or funding level, and both parties agree to enter into good faith discussions to address such request.
- 10. If University or the County in good faith determines that funding is no longer available to support the programs or positions providing services locally, either party may terminate this Agreement. Termination of the Agreement in its entirety requires a minimum of ninety (90) days prior notice. Notice shall be dated and provided in writing to the parties listed below as the contacts for this Agreement.

- 11. Each party agrees that it will be responsible for its own actions and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of the other party or the results thereof. The County's liability is governed by the provisions of Minn. Stat. Chap. 466 and other applicable laws. The University's liability is governed by the provisions of the Minnesota Tort Claims Act, Minn. Stat. §3.736 and other applicable law.
- 12. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §16C.05, Subd. 5, the University agrees that County, the State Auditor, or any of their duly authorized representatives at any time during normal business hours and as often as they may reasonably deem necessary, shall have access to and the right to examine, audit, excerpt, and transcribe any books, documents, papers, records, etc., which are pertinent to the accounting practices and procedures of relating to this Agreement. University agrees to maintain these records in accordance with applicable law.

- 13. All data collected, created, received, maintained, or disseminated for any purposes by the activities of University because of this Agreement is governed by the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Chap. 13, as amended, the Minnesota Rules implementing such Act now in force or as adopted, as well as Federal Regulations on data privacy.
- 14. The University is committed to the policy that all persons shall have equal access to its programs, facilities, and employment without regard to race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, age, marital status, disability, public assistance status, veteran status, sexual orientation or other classifications protected by state or federal law. In adhering to this policy, the University abides by the Minnesota Human Rights Act, Minnesota Statute Ch. 363A; by the Federal Civil Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. 2000e; by the requirements of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972; by Sections 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; by the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990; by Executive Order 11246, as amended; by 38 U.S.C. 2012, the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Assistance Act of 1972, as amended; and by other applicable statutes and regulations relating to equality of opportunity.

2022 Aitkin County Legislative Priorities

Administration

- 1. Aitkin County supports promoting legislation that preserves tax base in response to increased property tax appeals, utility tax refunds, and potential "dark store" assessing practices.
- 2. Aitkin County supports strengthening Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) funding programs to address regional inequalities and guarantee full property tax loss replacement.
- 3. Aitkin County support legislation that allows joint powers boards the opportunity to meet virtually without limits on the number of meetings held virtually per year or requirements that participants disclose their individual meeting location address.

Assessor

- 1. Simplification of the property tax system. We should support legislation that would reduce the number of classifications of property in Minnesota. When assessors spend lots of time classifying property, they have less time available to value property. The complexity makes the system difficult for most people to understand. After recent legislative changes, Minnesota now has a total of 68 classifications which is the most of any State in the US.
- 2. Increased safety of field employees. Change State Law to grant assessors access to location data of more predatory offenders. Field staff are required to do physical inspections of all real estate in the county. Not knowing where dangerous criminal live puts staff in the field at risk.
- 3. Raise the minimum value threshold for the taxation of personal property to \$10,000 for all personal property units including mobile homes, travel trailers, and park model trailers. Currently this only applies to travel trailers on campgrounds or resorts. Lower value units generate such a low tax amount that government loses money by taxing them.
- 4. Change the Disabled Veterans Market Value Exclusion to a state administered refund program. If this change would take place, the costs of the program would be spread over the whole State instead of shifting the tax burden on local governments.
- 5. Any new program mandated by the State should be funded by the State.

Attorney's Office

- 1. Additional sustainable (on-going) funding for County Attorneys for child protection.
- 2. Additional sustainable (on-going) funding for County Attorneys for the state judiciary's shift of a substantial amount of court administration duties to the County Attorneys' Offices.
- 3. Increased penalties for damage to public property and critical infrastructure.

Community Corrections

Aitkin County supports the following MN Association of Community Corrections Act Counties (MACCAC) legislative policy positions:

- 1. Long term, Minnesota needs a clear vision for correctional services that addresses the role of prisons, community supervision and the state's role in funding. This is particularly important since counties provide local jail incarceration and the vast majority of community supervision, which are key alternatives to prisons. The legislature is chronically underfunding Minnesota community supervision. Action is required this session to preserve effective community supervision that protects Minnesota citizens. Minnesota Community Correction Act counties are in need of a supplemental budget appropriation of 4% for each year of the current biennium to address the state's share of their operating adjustment.
- 2. Community Corrections Act (CCA) Jurisdictions Supporting the expansion of CCA counties with state funding and the removal of systemic/statutory requirements that act as barriers to counties in choosing the delivery system that best meets their individual needs.
- 3. Structural Change in Distribution of Funds Future funding should be allocated using an equitable and transparent model that considers the need of each county.
- 4. Justice Reinvestment bring the Justice Reinvestment Initiative of the Council of State Governments to the state of Minnesota.
- 5. Juvenile Justice Reform Juvenile reform should continue and focus on: eliminating racial and ethnic disparities, reducing collateral consequences facing justice-involved youth; and modifying the current requirement for juvenile sex offenders to register as predatory offenders.

Economic Development

- 1. Increased funding for the State Grant In Aid (GIA) trails for ATV use. ATV riding is a fast growing family activity and current GIA funding is not keeping up for trail construction or maintenance.
- 2. Aitkin County supports Broadband development in rural areas, under-served and un-served areas. Continue to make Broadband improvement a state priority.
- 3. Aitkin County supports programs that develop workforce training, vocational training and specialized trade training for all residents.
- 4. Aitkin County supports legislation that continues to provide assistance to small businesses recovering from the pandemic.

Environmental Services

- Aitkin County and MACPZA support increased Natural Resources Block Grant (NRBG) funding and
 continued flexibility for the use of the funding. Aitkin County and MACPZA also support administering and
 allocating current NRBG funding for mandated state programs through the Minnesota Department of
 Revenue, similar to County Program Aid. Allocations for mandated state programs through the NRBG
 should not be considered grants.
- 2. Aitkin County and MACPZA support modifications to the SSTS licensing programs to ensure tests are consistent with course materials and Minnesota Rules 7080-7083.
- 3. Aitkin County and MACPZA support state (DNR) assistance with implementation of regional executive boards to address aquatic invasive species challenges and meet minimum standards developed by MAIRSC, MNDNR, MACPZA, and MLR.
- 4. Aitkin County and SWAA support allocating 100 percent of the revenue generated by the Solid Waste Management Tax (SWMT) to state and county waste management activities, including increased funding for SCORE (Governor's Select Committee on Recycling and the Environment) grants to counties.
- Aitkin County and SWAA support efforts to make improvements that would maximize the e-waste recycling program. Additionally, SWAA supports the use of manufacturer payments to fully reimburse county collection and recycling costs. Furthermore, SWAA supports reducing end-of-life costs to consumers through increased manufacturer responsibility.
- 6. Aitkin County and SWAA support requiring the MPCA to issue, and/or reissue all demolition land disposal facility permits, in a timely manner, in accordance with the MPCA's 2005 Guidance Document (as listed on the MPCA website) until such guidance are otherwise modified by new Rule or Statute.
- 7. Aitkin County supports legislation prohibiting new captive cervid farms in the state and further calls upon state agencies to immediately prohibit the transport of farmed cervids within the state and halt the registration of any new captive cervid farms until such time that the legislature enacts such legislation.
- 8. Aitkin County and SWAA support bonding requests for proposed solid waste management projects as a partial match to the funds that counties invest in infrastructure for safe, environmentally sound management of solid wastes mandated by the state.
- 9. Aitkin County and SWAA support the use of manufacturer payments to fully reimburse county collection and recycling costs.
- 10. Aitkin County and SWAA support State encouragement and funding to prevent food waste and divert food scraps and other organics from the MSW stream, and resolve permitting and other issues to facilitate expansion of composting and other organic management facilities and methods.
- 11. Aitkin County and SWAA support standards/labeling requirements for compostable products to reduce processing impacts and costs of contamination at composting facilities.

Health & Human Services

- 1. Aitkin County supports modernization investments that align with the Modernization Strategic plan and take the fresh approach that has been laid out in the Gartner recommendations. Implementation of the Modernization Strategic plan will ensure development of an interoperable system, will improve efficiency, effectiveness, and reduce the costs of the delivery of services, enhance customer service, and expand county decision-making authority. This includes resource support to counties for developing community services that support modernization, an integrative application process, and application of agile practices or "LEAN" processes to identify and correct system problems early on.
- Aitkin County supports Direct Care and Treatment Cost of Care Policy Changes. This includes development
 of a review process for discharges and subsequent financial responsibility for Does Not Meet Criteria
 (DNMC) days. Additionally, tools need to be developed to work in partnership with counties to reduce
 DNMC days at direct care and treatment facilities.
- 3. Aitkin County supports changes to the Consolidated Chemical Dependency Treatment Fund (CCDTF) under the Under Substance Use Disorder(SUD) Reform: As a result of SUD Reform and Direct Access, counties have been taken out of the treatment decision-making role, yet currently under statute remain financially responsible for eligible clients. Counties should no longer be financially responsible for a county share in costs that are paid through the Behavioral Health Fund.
- 4. Aitkin County supports a state implementation of Family First Prevention Service Act (FFPSA) that meets the core tenants of the federal statute and ensures equitable access to services state-wide, assuring financial sustainability to counties and avoiding unfunded mandates and cost shifts to counties.

Highway Department

- Local Road Improvement Program/Local Bridge Bonding Program Aitkin County supports immediate funding of the Local Road Improvement Program and the Local Bridge
 Bonding Program to fund regionally significant local road and bridge projects throughout the state.
- Increase in Highway Funding Aitkin County supports long term, sustainable transportation funding increases distributed through the
 Highway User Tax Distribution Fund by increases in the state gas tax and license tab fees. Aitkin County
 also supports dedicating the existing sales tax revenue on motor vehicle parts to the Highway User Tax
 Distribution Fund.

Human Resources

- 1. Change the frequency of reporting for pay equity from every three years to every five years.
- 2. Simplify the process and shorten the timeline (no longer than 6 months) for Minnesota counties who are interested in exiting the Minnesota Merit System. Allow counties to exit at any time throughout the calendar year.
- 3. Clearly state in the law that County Boards (and city/township/school) are allowed to discuss non-union wages and benefits in closed session too, in addition to union negotiations strategy.

4. Oppose any new state-mandated time off benefits such as the Paid Family and Medical Leave benefit program, funded by employees and employers. Public employers currently provide generous leave accrual banks. Allow public employers and unions to negotiate paid time off benefits without a state mandate.

Land Department

- Support changes to MS 282 (Tax Forfeited Land Laws): As directed by the county board, the county
 auditor may lease tax-forfeited land under the terms and conditions prescribed by the county board for
 the purposes of investigating, analyzing, and developing conservation easements that provide ecosystem
 services. And The county auditor, under the terms and conditions prescribed by the county board,
 including reversion in the event of nonuse, may convey conservation easements as defined in section
 84C.01 on tax-forfeited land.
- 2. Continue forest road grants to counties to maintain county-administered forest roads to counties that have appointed land commissioners.
- 3. The burden of blighted properties within City limits is falling onto County governments. Counties have little influence on how a City may or may not enforce blight issues prior to a property forfeiting. Final property cleanup is often deferred to Counties after years leading to forfeiture. Failure to act in a timely manner is exacerbating the blight issues. Cities should retain the administration of tax forfeited properties after forfeiture.
- 4. Secure funding needs to be in place to deal with derelict tax forfeited properties.
- 5. There should be an increase to the maximum \$12,000 lease amount to accommodate cell tower lease agreements. Counties are not able to enter cell tower agreements. Language should include the lease value and lease term to be determined by the county board as well as reverter language for non-use. (282.04 TIMBER SALES; LAND USE, LEASE, PARTITION, EASEMENT. Subdy 1(d))
- 6. Environmental education is extremely important to our region. Efforts to support curriculum and RELC's (i.e. Long Lake CC) is vital to acquiring/protecting lands for our future.
- 7. Legislation to support use of Outdoor Heritage (Legacy) funds to support updating forest inventory on County/State lands – how can we protect/enhance habitat if we have irregular data on what we currently have?
- 8. Support state funding to local government units for beaver control.

Sheriff's Office

- 1. Pursue legislation that would prohibit firearms in county buildings where court services occur.
- 2. Pursue legislation that would continue medical assistance payments for incarcerated individuals allowing for more mental health and chemical addiction treatment options which may result in stabilization after release and reduced recidivism. (Federal program)

Treasurer's Office

- 1. Under Return of state fees Suggest adding Marriage License fees to be retained by the county as the state receives most of the revenue but all the work is done in Treasurer's office.
- 2. Have Mobile Homes returned to tabs issued by the DVM rather than being taxed thru the property tax system or raising the value threshold for them to be taxed thru the property tax system.
