At the time of his passing, all three of Bryan and Theresa's children were minors. All of Bryan's possessions were in physical possession of his sister Brenda Daniels of Loretto, MN. Bryan had no will and despite rightfully his possessions go to the three children, she kept control of all Bryan's things and to date the children received nothing. Bryan had his sister also beneficiary to all pension funds and life insurance, Theresa then hired a probate attorney 2 1/2 - 3 years ago to file probate in Aitkin and Hennepin counties. She was also told that to act on behalf of the children, conservatorship was necessary at a cost of around \$5,000. Bryan and Theresa's youngest child turns 18 (all children need to be 18 for probate for them to represent Bryan's estate) on January 2, 2022. In addition, Theresa filed bankruptcy in 2017 and as the only asset was the lien against said property has been paying \$650/month for the children to keep this property as Bryan designed and built and it is the only thing they have and the memories created here. This added to the hardship of a single parent and single income household. Jerica, Chloe, and Sean got jobs and remained full time student with high GPA's and Theresa with self-employment income contributed to the property taxes as able. Jerica has one year of college left of Architecture degree, Chloe is a freshman in college on track to be a social worker, and Sean is a senior in High school with a desire of an engineering degree. 
