Since the onset of the COVID crisis in March, revenue opportunities have ceased. Nearly the entire staff has been furloughed. Courtney Dowell (education mgr.) and Anthony Miller (maintenance) are working reduced hours. Recognizing the financial situation, the Land Dept and LLCC met with the budget committee on 6/2/2020 with options to move forward. LLCC and the Land Dept. now seek the direction from the entire County Board. Attached are three scenarios regarding staffing of LLCC. 1) Close LLCC and lay off staff through 2020, 2) Retain only education manager on reduced hours and to furlough maintenance until August. At that time reopen. LLCC to non-school groups on a limited basis. Continue to seek relief funding, alternative funding, and grants, or 3) Identical to option #2, but retain both admin, and maintenance staff at reduced hours.
