Project overview

Aitkin County currently uses RTVision's Automated Account Payable system - GovAP. While GovAP has been an improvement and leads to efficiency when processing warrants, we have discovered many limitations. Aitkin County currently ApplicationXtender as our electronic document management system and we have had very positive results. With this new AP Workflow system, we would increase our efficiency in many ways.

Road and Bridge would be able to use the new system - currently, GovAP does not interface with New Roads.

Health and Human Services would have increased processing abilities. While SSIS would not interface, the systems do work together.

The County can create templates which would decrease data entry for routine monthly payments like utilities and phone.

The County would be able to process Manual Payments. Currently these payments are handled with paper vouchers because the GovAP system is not able to process Manual Payments.

There are other user friendly upgrades that make processing more efficient in all departments.

Yearly maintenance will be \$1,800. Currently we pay \$7,500 per year for maintenance.

We are planning to implement by January 1, 2023.
